HAPPY NEW YEAR!!!!!!!!!!

How is everyone doing this fine day and enjoying 2012?????

I wanted to point something out to all of you in case you did not notice it. We now have votive candles in the church. There are two banks of 40 in the church flanking the statue of Mary. There are another two banks of 40 flanking the tabernacle in the chapel. These are votive candles that will burn for six days each. So please take advantage of something so many of you have requested. We do have a prayer posted on the wall above the candles along with a suggested donation per candle.

So what is the purpose of a votive candle? The lighting of a votive candle indicates that someone is praying about something in particular, either for themselves or on behalf of someone else. The word "votive" can also refer to a promise to pray for someone, as well as a wish or desire for a certain outcome on behalf of someone, such as a recovery of health. Remember in John 8:12, Jesus tells us, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of the life." The candles are meant to show that light and draw us closer to God.

On this New Years Day, which is also the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God, I ask you to reflect on the following as you enjoy the new year:

What does Luke mean, "reflecting... in her heart?" Have you ever held an experience or feeling close to your heart that was beyond words?

Can you find a feeling that you cherish and hold it close to your heart?

When "God's face shines upon us," is it an expression of feeling God's love within? Try to describe that feeling.

Can you hold a peace in your heart that is free from material desire and worldly irritation?

"The emptiness and interior solitude and peace without which we cannot be filled with God were given by Him to Mary in order that she might receive Him into the world by offering Him the hospitality of a being that was perfectly pure, perfectly silent, perfectly at rest, perfectly at peace, and centered in utter humility. If we ever manage to empty ourselves of the noise of the world and of our own passions, it is because she has been sent close to us by God and given us to share in her sanctity and hiddenness." (Merton, Thomas, New Seeds of Contemplation)

Mary's divine motherhood broadens the Christmas spotlight. Mary has an important role to play in the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. She consents to God's invitation conveyed by the angel (Luke 1:26-38). Elizabeth pro-

claims: "Most blessed are you among women and blessed is the *fruit of your womb*. And how does this happen to me, that *the mother of my Lord* should come to me?" (Luke 1:42-43, emphasis added). Mary's role as mother of God places her in a unique position in God's redemptive plan.



The precise title "Mother of God" goes back at least to the third or fourth century. In the Greek form $\Theta\epsilon ot \acute{\sigma}\kappa o \varsigma$ (Theotokos = Birth-giver to God or Mother of God Incarnate), it became the touchstone of the Church's teaching about the Incarnation. The Council of Ephesus in 431 insisted that the holy Fathers were right in calling the holy virgin Theotokos. At the end of this particular session, crowds of peo-

ple marched through the street shouting: "Praised be the Theotokos!" The tradition reaches to our own day. In its chapter on Mary's role in the Church, Vatican II's *Dogmatic Constitution on the Church* calls Mary "Mother of God" 12 times.

The Blessed Virgin was eternally predestined, in conjunction with the incarnation of the divine Word, to be the Mother of God. By decree of divine Providence, she served on earth as the loving mother of the divine Redeemer, an associate of unique nobility, and the Lord's humble handmaid. She conceived, brought forth, and nourished Christ" (Dogmatic Constitution on the Church,





We will continue an in-depth reflection on the Liturgy, the Holy Mass, through the lens of the New Roman Missal during each of the Faith UNwrapped sessions of the 2011-2012 season. The January session will focus on the Gathering Rites of the Mass. Faith UNwrapped is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on our faith together as a whole parish. The Faith UNwrapped format allows for intergenerational formation as well as exploration and insights that are designed for each persons age and faith development. There are breakout sessions for adults and youth at various age levels.

In his account of the birth of Jesus, Luke turns our focus to Mary, Jesus mother, in one brief statement. He says, "And Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart."

We could ask ourselves, what reflections of our own might match those of Mary. If we shared a conversation with Mary, what would we say? What would she say? He started 80 new parishes and many schools while he was the bishop. St. John cared about the needs of the people and did whatever he could do to make a difference. 
