

Hello all!

This Wednesday marks the feast of the Conversion of St. Paul the Apostle. This conversion can be summed up in a singular event and that is the road to Damascus. Paul, (Saul at the time) had a zealot's hatred for all Jesus' stood for, as in Acts 8:3b "... entering house after house and dragging out men and women, he handed them over for imprisonment", Paul was relentless in his persecution of Christians. But his encounter on the road to Damascus changed all of this. After encountering Christ, Paul "harnessed his energy into one new goal, and that was being a slave of Christ in the ministry of reconciliation, an instrument to help others experience the one Savior." The great message of Paul to the world was: "You are saved entirely by God, not by anything you can do. Saving faith is the give of total, free, personal and loving commitment to Christ, a commitment that then bears fruit in more works than the Law could ever contemplate."

# **FAITH WORKS**

Christian prayer is modeled after the prayer of Jesus. Like his, it should come from the heart. When he prayed, Jesus used words and signs and sometimes cries, as expressions of his heart. And so do we when we pray; our

hearts too look for an outward voice.

The words and signs that Jesus used when he prayed often came from his own Jewish tradition, from what he learned in his family and from others. As for ourselves, we turn to our Christian tradition for guidance in prayer. We believe it is a tradition inspired by the Holy Spirit, and it is also an outgrowth of the Jewish tradition of prayer that nourished Jesus himself.

The Christian tradition of prayer has a wisdom all its own, with many different forms and expressions. Some basic prayers of our Christian tradition, however, have a special place. The Sign of the Cross is one example.

In the Catholic church and other Christian churches the Sign of the Cross is an important part of personal and public prayer. It originated in the earliest days of Christianity and so it is centuries old. It is the first sign made on us at Baptism and the last sign made as we pass to our future life. It's a vital part of liturgical prayer and the sacraments. With the Sign of the Cross we begin and end our prayers. We call it a blessing. We say we "bless ourselves." Tracing with our hand the figure of the cross on our forehead, our chest, our shoulders, we bless ourselves.

The Sign of the Cross expresses blessing. It symbolizes God blessing us, God embracing us with blessings. And in this same sign we express our belief in God from whom all our blessings flow. In the Sign of the Cross we embrace our good God with mind and heart and all of our strength.

God blesses. The Jewish scriptures describe God as, above all, the One who blesses. God blessed Noah and saved the world from the flood. God blessed Abraham and Sara with blessings more than the stars in the sky. God blessed the Jewish people, redeeming them from the slavery of Egypt. Life itself and all creation are God's gifts.

When we bless ourselves with the Sign of the Cross we remember the One who blesses us: the triune God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

With the Sign of the Cross we recall in particular the blessing of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We trace a cross on ourselves, the cross of Jesus. His death on the Cross was an outpouring of love for us. The Sign of the Cross is a reminder of his love, a love found not only in the past, but here and now, as we make this sign upon ourselves; for the love of Jesus Christ abides forever.

The Sign of the Cross is a wonderful daily expression of our relationship with God. God is the One who blesses. This prayer reminds us that each day, in good times and bad, in danger and sorrow, God's care and blessings are never far from us.

# Cucchi's Corner



#### Francis de Sales (1567-1622) Bishop, Doctor

January 24th we celebrate the feast day of St. Francis de Sales, Bishop of Geneva and Doctor of the Church. He was co-founder with Frances de Chantal of the order of the Visitation (the Visitandines). Francis is patron saint of the catholic press and Pope Pius XI declared him patron saint of journalists.

De Sales was born at the family castle, chateau de Sales at Thorens, Savoy on August 21, 1567. The very next day he was baptized at the parish in Thorens. At age 8, he went to study at the college of Annecy where he made his First Holy Communion. Later he studied at the Jesuit College of Clermont in Paris. Sons of noble families of Savoy usually attended College de Navarre, but Francis single-minded in regards to his calling and vocation, attended Cleremont which was know for its piety and academics. Francis then studied law and theology at the University of Padua, receiving his Doctor of Law degree at age 24.

The aspects of De Sales life that I find compelling were that his father urged him to take fencing, riding and dance lessons but Frances, not all that interested in these, stayed focused on serving God. In reading about De Sales, it often spoke of how he lived with very austere accommodations. Many adults and children loved and remembered his very creative "Bishop's Catechism.

Faith UNwrapped: Say What? Rite Words February 3,4, 5, 6, 7 & 8

This week we had our second session of Faith UNwrapped: <u>Say</u> <u>What? Belonging.</u> It was a great opportunity to reflect on the Gathering Rites of the Mass. The formal name of this part of the Mass is the <u>Introductory Rites of</u> <u>the Mass</u>; but the word "gathering" gives a huge hint into the significance of these rites. These rites gather us into a community of people who have come together to worship. We are the family of God.

The rituals which make up the Introductory Rites serve as visual , auditory, and active expressions and experiences of our unity as the people of God. They introduce our thoughts to the mystery of the particular liturgical season or festivity being celebrated. They help us enter into the sacred meaning of this holy celebration.

One important reflection that was considered during the January Faith UNwrapped was that God wants us to be fully aware as we celebrate Mass. The best way to make this happen is to prepare for the Eucharist ahead of time. Another thought was about how important it is for us to participate fully and actively.

In each of the breakout sessions for the various age groups, we considered how our celebration of the Mass compares so favorably to family celebrations, with which we are very familiar. We prepare for celebrations such as birthday parties and holiday celebrations and we participate from beginning to end. Our families deserve this. How much more does God deserve this preparation and participation? If you missed this month's Faith UNwrapped, I encourage you to look for a Take Home Gift in the Gathering Area. There are some wonderful reflections on this topic in the Take Home Gift.

Next month in the February Faith UNwrapped we will consider the words of the Acclamation and Prayers, for example the Gloria and the Creed. We continue our reflections on the Mass through the lens of the New Roman Missal. We have entitled the February Faith UNwrapped:


