I enjoy the winter but I am sure all of you are thinking, boy is this a great savings on the heating bill!!!!

Normally I try to get away before Lent to have a break from the cold to somewhere that is warm! This year I am not going to be doing that. With us being in the middle of the Changing Lives Together program, I just will not have time for that until after lent begins, so this year I am not heading anywhere until March. More on that in the future!

Lent is coming upon us relatively quickly. You know Ash Wednesday is only a week and a half away, so you need to start prepping yourselves for that season as well. I will also address that a bit more in my article next weekend.

I do want to say thanks to all the people who helped to pass out the information packets for the Changing Lives Together program and to all of you who are truly giving time for prayerful consideration on what you can do for the program. Remember this Wednesday the 15th we are having another Advanced Commitment gathering at 7:00 pm. If you wish to come, please call the office so we can have an accurate account of the number we will have. That way we will have enough appetizers for all.

Now as you go home this week I ask you to reflect on the following from our liturgical celebration:

Does everyone "bear the sore of leprosy?" is anyone unable of being cleansed?

Who is free from guile (duplicity)?

How is the leper transformed? How did he know that Jesus would make him clean?

How do you imitate Christ and then become Christlike?

"Again, that expression, *le point vierge*, (I cannot translate it) comes in here. At the center of our being is a point of nothingness which is untouched by sin and by illusion, a point of pure truth, a point or spark which belongs entirely to *God*, which is never at our disposal, from which God disposes of our lives, which is inaccessible to the fantasies of our own mind or the brutalities of our own will. This little point of nothingness and of *absolute poverty* is the pure glory of God in us. It is so to speak His name written in us, as our poverty, as our indigence, as our dependence, as our sonship. It is like a pure diamond, blazing with the invisible light of heaven. It is in everybody, and if we could see it we would see these billions of points of light coming together in the face and blaze of a sun that would make all the darkness and cruelty of life vanish completely. . . . I have no program for this seeing. It is only given. But the gate of heaven is everywhere." (Merton, Thomas, *Conjectures of a Guilty Bystander*)

FAITH WORKS

Lent begins Feb.22 Interestingly, the word "lent" comes from Old. Looking at its origin, "lent" is a shortening of the word "lengthen," used to describe the increasing amount of daylight each day. It was used to describe the harbinger of spring and new life.

When we think of spring we often think of sap running in trees, buds opening, green grass, tulips and daffodils popping out of the ground and we also think of spring cleaning. Lent is a time for spiritual spring cleaning. We clean out the clutter that has accumulated in our lives to make more room for God and one another.

Historical Factoid: Lent

Church historians tell us that there is enough evidence to indicate that by the end of the fourth century, a forty day period of fasting was observed in parts of the church in commemoration of Christ's forty days in the desert. But then Lent developed into a penitential season for preparing for Easter. By the end of the fourth century Lent had two emphases: it was the time of formation and preparation for the catechumens who would be baptized at the Easter vigil on Holy Saturday; and it was a time of reconciliation for those members of the church whose sins had separated them from God and the church.


The shape and understanding of Lent changed with time. The public reconciliation of penitents died out, as did the catechumenate. Lent had shifted from a season of baptismal renewal to a liturgical season of fasting.

The Bishops of the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965) called for the restoration of the original meaning of Lent. Here is what the bishops had to say about Lent in the *Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy:*

"The season of Lent is both a time of preparation for baptism and a time of penance for the faithful, in both cases to prepare for Easter. Hence the practice of penance should be fostered in ways that suit our time and the local region." (#'s 109-110 of The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, in Vatican II in Plain English Vol 2, p. 116)

What the document makes clear is that as a church our Lenten priorities should be: the catechumens' preparation for baptism and the renewal of the faithful in their baptismal commitment. Our repentance during Lent is to be individual and private as well as communal and public.

Cucchi's Corner





This week Susan reminds us that today is World Marriage Day. This day was started in 1981 when couples in Baton Rouge, LA encouraged the Mayor, the Governor and the Bishop to proclaim St. Valentine's Day "We Believe in Marriage Day." The idea was eventually adopted by the Worldwide Marriage Encounter and was designated to be celebrated on the second Sunday of February. In 1993 Pope John Paul II, offered his Apostolic blessing in honor of World Marriage Day.

The World Marriage Day website (http:// wmd.wwme.org/index.html) offers some suggestions for celebrating this day. I especially like two of the suggestions for couples to do together on this day. One idea is to sit and review your courtship and wedding pictures together. Another suggestion is to tell the story of how you met and fell in love to your children.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I write to you concerning an alarming and serious threat to religious liberty in the United States. Under the First Amendment to the Constitution, we should be left free to love God according to our conscience. The government should not force us to choose between violating our consciences or violating the law. And yet, the federal government has just dealt a heavy blow to the fundamental right to religious liberty for all citizens of any faith.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services announced last month that almost all employers, *including Catholic and other religious employers*, will be *forced* to offer their employees health coverage that includes sterilization, abortion-inducing drugs, and contraception. Almost all health insurers will be *forced* to include those "services" in the health policies they write. And almost all individuals will be *forced* to buy that coverage as a part of their policies. The Administration's sole concession was to give our institutions one year to comply.

As a result, unless the rule is overturned, we Catholics will be compelled either to violate our consciences, or to drop health coverage for our employees (and suffer the penalties for doing so). Shockingly, the Administration has adopted a definition of religion so narrow that it would force us to *only* offer charity to those who are Catholic. Under the Administration's logic, we would have to ask people for their baptismal certificate before we allow them to enter one of our soup kitchens. Surely, one could not claim that Mother Teresa was engaging in religion only when she was in the chapel and not when she reached out to others in whom she saw the face of Christ. Yet, this is the meaning of the Administration's definition of religion.

We cannot—we will not—comply with this unjust law. This is not just a "Catholic" issue. Rather, this decision affects religious believers of all traditions. We are already joined by our brothers and sisters of all faiths and many others of good will in this important effort to regain our religious freedom. In generations past, the Church has always been able to count on the faithful to stand up and protect her sacred rights and duties. I call upon this generation of the faithful of the Archdiocese of Detroit to do the same. Our children and grandchildren deserve nothing less.

I would ask of you two things. <u>First</u>, as a community of faith we must commit ourselves to prayer and fasting that wisdom and justice may prevail and religious liberty may be restored. <u>Second</u>, I would also recommend visiting the website <u>www.usccb.org/conscience</u>, to learn more about this issue and how to contact Congress in support of legislation that would reverse the Administration's decision.

America is a better place when we are free to love God. Please join with me in ensuring that this assault on religious liberty is overturned. Asking God's blessings upon you through the intercession of our patroness Saint Anne, I remain
