Hello All,

Well we were suppose to start CSA this weekend but as I said in mass, that is not happening right now. I am putting off CSA for our parish until the beginning of June. I think you all have been hit pretty hard with the Changing Lives Together campaign and I felt you needed a little more of a break between the two campaigns. However, I will be hitting you hard with CSA when we start at the beginning of June, so get ready for that in about a month!

This week on Tuesday we celebrate St. Joseph the Worker. In Italy this is a national holiday. Here in the States, I don't think many people (including Catholics) know about this feast day in the Church.

This feast was commemorated by Pope Pius XII on May 1, 1955 which was also the tenth anniversary of the Catholic Association of Italian Workers. The Italian Workers gathered in St. Peter's square for this commemoration to hear the Pope exclaim: "You have beside you a shepherd, a defender and a father" in Saint Joseph. Joseph the carpenter, a man entrusted by God to be the human father of His son, is a quiet but strong figure for us all.

St. Joseph, because of the role he played, as chosen by God, was a man of "tried virtue and consummate holiness." Like Abraham, Joseph was a man of faith and obedience; like Isaac, a man of prayer and vision; like Jacob, he was patient and self-sacrificing; like Joseph of Egypt, his chastity was inviolable. And like David, from whom he directly descends, he is a royal intercessor according to the heart of God. St. Joseph, the *just man* to whom the Son of God Himself was subject to as a father, whom all Christians can go to with confidence, will see to their spiritual and temporal needs with paternal goodness.

As you head home today, maybe you can reflect on the following from our scripture readings:

How does the resurrection of Jesus change your life?

How is it possible for mortal beings to become known as "children of God"?

Are all welcomed by Jesus and the Father regardless of their background?

How do you follow Jesus and "lay down" your life and take it up again?

The fruits of evangelization are changed lives and a changed world—holiness and justice, spirituality and peace. The validity of our having accepted the Gospel does not only come from what we feel or what we know; it comes also from the way we serve others, especially the poorest, the most marginal, the most hurting, the most defenseless, and the least loved. An evangelization that stays inside ourselves is not an evangelization into the Good News of Jesus Christ. (USCCB, *Go and Make Disciples*)

FAITH WORKS

The liturgical season of Easter is 50 days! The Church wants us to reflect on the meaning of the resurrection of Jesus. Its impact is enormous. It is the core tenet and mystery of our faith.

Ten different appearances of our risen Lord are recorded in the New Testament. They may be arranged as follows:

1. To Mary Magdalene at the sepulchre alone. This is recorded at length only by John (20:11-18), and alluded to by Mark (16:9-11).
2. To certain women, "the other Mary," Salome, Joanna, and others, as they returned from the sepulchre. Matthew (28:1-10) alone gives an account of this. (Comp. Mark 16:1-8, and Luke 24:1-11.)
3. To Simon Peter alone on the day of the resurrection. (See Luke 24:34; 1 Cor. 15:5.)
4. To the two disciples on the way to Emmaus on the day of the resurrection, recorded fully only by Luke (24:13-35). Comp. Mark 16:12, 13).
5. To the ten disciples (Thomas being absent) and others "with them," at Jerusalem on the evening of the resurrection day. One of the evangelists gives an account of this appearance, John (20:19-24).
6. To the disciples again (Thomas being present) at Jerusalem (Mark 16:14-18; Luke 24:33-40; John 20:26-28. See also 1 Cor. 15:5).
7. To the disciples when fishing at the Sea of Galilee. Of this appearance also John (21:1-23) alone gives an account.
8. To the eleven, and above 500 brethren at once, at an appointed place in Galilee (1 Cor. 15:6; comp. Matt. 28:16-20).
9. To James, but under what circumstances we are not informed (1 Cor. 15:7).
10. To the apostles immediately before the ascension. They accompanied him from Jerusalem to Mount Olivet, and there they saw him ascend "till a cloud received him out of their sight" (Mark 16:19; Luke 24:50-52; Acts 1:4-10).

Jesus of Nazareth was the man who came to tell us that it is all right to trust our hopefulness. "Dream your most impossible dream," he tells us. "Hope your most expansive hope, fantasize your wildest fantasy, and you will have just begun. Out beyond those dreams, hopes, and fantasies, the generosity of my heavenly Father only begins. For eye has not seen nor has ear heard nor has it entered into the human heart what the heavenly Father

has prepared for those who return his love."

It is the nature of hope that it shatters our sorrows and our fears, our disappointments and our anxieties. Hope has its healing effect because it enables us to see things differently, to put together the pieces of our life in a pattern we may not have tried before. Hope throws something new into the picture (or, more often, perhaps, throws a spotlight on something old, lighting it in such a way that it is almost as though we had never seen it before).

Our life can begin all over again. If we hold on to hope, we can see possibilities in the other and in ourselves which were not apparent before. Angers and injuries dissolve and love is reborn.

Jesus is the man of hope. He is the Christ, the one whose words and deeds reveal the heavenly Father to us as he was never revealed before. Jesus is the "sacrament" of God, the best revelation we will ever have of what God is like.

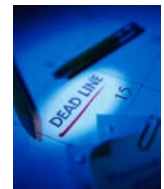

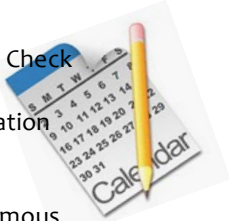
