This weekend we also want to say a fond thanks to all of the mothers out here as we celebrate this Mother's Day weekend! We are so grateful for what you do for us throughout the course of our lives—the unspoken words of encouragement when we are down and the strength you give to our entire family, THANKS FOR ALL YOU DO!

We are slowly nearing the end of the Easter Season. Next weekend is the Ascension, transferred from Thursday in the United States. The following weekend is Pentecost, the culmination of this Easter Season when we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit giving those charged to spread the word and church throughout the world to have the strength to do that very thing! But for now lets stay focused on this weekend and the 6th Sunday of Easter.

In our Gospel reading we have a complete circle of love. God loved the Son, Jesus. The Son loves his followers, and the followers show their love for God through their love for one another. It is clear in this reading that while we are part of this circle, we are only part of it because God chose us to be. Our response to God's choice for us is simply to show our love for God through the love we show to other human beings.

As you head home this weekend I ask you to consider the following:

How do you feel God's love?

Did you do anything to earn God's love?

Is there anything that you can do to prevent God's love for you?

What do you ask from God in the name of Jesus?

"Remember how St. Augustine tells us about seeking God in many places and eventually finding Him within himself. Do you suppose it is of little importance that a soul which is often distracted should come to understand this truth and to find that, in order to speak to the Eternal Father and to take its delight in Him, it has no need to go to heaven and speak in a loud voice? However quietly we speak, He is so near that he will hear us: we need no wings to go in search of Him but have only to find a place where we can be alone and look upon Him present within us. Nor need we feel strange in the presence of so kind a Guest; we must talk to Him very humbly, as we should to our father, ask Him for things as we should ask a father, tell Him our troubles ... Remember how important it is for you to have understood this truth – that the Lord is within us and that we should be there with Him." (Teresa of Avila, The Way of Perfection)

FAITH WORKS

What is the cost of love? When we frame love in this question, the subject transcends the feeling. No longer does love remain in the realm of the heart. It becomes a decision of the will. The question implies that we do not truly

love unless we are willing to act upon our feelings and live with the consequences. Love may not be love without an inner emotion, but it cannot survive without action. And it cannot grow without testing.

To claim love is easy, to live love is difficult. Yet, in Jesus, we find the example of love perfectly lived out. We also find the power to live love to the fullest.

Jesus "chose" his "friends." They did not choose him. Jesus chose his followers for a mission: to "lay down" their lives as he did, so their self-giving might produce lasting "fruit." Hence, the kernel of Christian spirituality, self-giving ("laying down" life), roots the Christian community, fellowship based upon service (fruit that will last). Both of these notions were based upon love. When Christians truly loved others, even to the point of death, they became "friends" of Jesus and the Father.

When have you felt the love of God? When have you passed that love onto others? How did your efforts effect those you loved?

"Gloria" Revised order of the Mass

We have been singing a new setting of the Gloria by Carroll Thomas Andrews. He was the Director of Music for many years in the diocese of St. Augustine. The Gloria or as it is sometimes referred to: The Great Doxology (hymnus angelicus) is preferably sung on Sundays & Holy Days of Obligation. Starting out first as a morning hymn of praise in the east then later came to the west becoming part of the Mass. The beginning of the text, and we, bear witness (and herald) the song of the angels at the Nativity (Luke 2:14).

The new translation is as follows:

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ. Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.
