Hello all,

I have actually been meaning to address this issue in my article for some time now. Just been putting it off I guess, however on Friday I received an article on this very subject and said well I guess God is finally kicking me in the head and telling me it is time to talk about this. The issue: LEAVING MASS EARLY! And so, this article is from the very article given to me by a Fr. Lawrence Adamczyk, these words reflect my own thoughts.

We have always used the analogy of the Church as Jesus being the Bridegroom and the Church being the Bride. Given that and if we "The Church" receive the Eucharist and immediately walk out is not only disrespectful to our Spouse, Jesus, but means we truly do not understand what has just happened!

Upon the reception of the Eucharist we have all just received "the God of the Universe, the One who created you, the One who died on the cross for you, the Eternal, the Almighty God into your heart and soul and you don't even stop to say 'thank you' to your spouse." The question is: How can you have a deep personal intimate relationship with the one who loves you more then you can ever know, if you leave as soon as YOU get what YOU want?

On the 29th of May, I will have been ordained for 8 years and after every mass I stand in the back of the Church to say hello and goodbye to everyone. When people leave mass immediately after the reception of the Eucharist my heart is broken, not because as St. Paul says that "we must render an account." It breaks my heart because of the Book of Wisdom, "I… deemed riches nothing in comparison with her, nor did I liken any priceless gem to her; because all gold, in view of her is a little sand." We as a people should always show a **GREAT REVERENCE** to the Eucharist. I know this is not my feeling because I am a priest. Many people feel this way and understand it! To leave early is to **NOT** show reverence to the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, this breaks my heart!!! I wonder if we understand that after we receive **Holy Communion, we are a walking tabernacle.** I wonder what is so important, week after week, that one cannot spend a few moments in thanksgiving for receiving the Almighty God into their being?

As in the gospel story of the rich young man, "he went away sad, for he had many possessions, possessions that were more important than Jesus." "By our baptism, we are all called to that intimate and personal love that God has for each one of us." It cannot be that only the priest has a deep and personal relationship with God. Fr. Pedro Aruppe, one time superior General of the Jesuits is quoted as saying, "Nothing is more practical than finding God, that is, than falling in love in a quite absolute, final way."

"What you are in love with, what seizes your imagination will affect everything." It will decide what will get you out of bed in the morning, what you will do with your evenings, how you will spend your weekends, what you read, who you know, what breaks your heart, and what amazes you with joy and gratitude. Fall in love, stay in love and it will decide everything. Remember love is not about feeling or emotions; love is not about sex; love is about the choice to sacrifice for the good of the other.

There are so many times when someone we whatever reason, someone has to move on after the visit is over. and irrevocably change a relationship. Almost always this is painful, sometimes so painful that it leaves us feeling restless and

empty, as if all the color, energy and joy have gone out of our lives.

But, as we know, this usually isn't the end of the story. Most of the time, after the restless, dark heartache of a painful goodbye has worn off, we experience the opposite, a deep joy in sensing now our loved one's presence in a different way.

Parents, for example, experience this when their children grow up and leave home to start lives of their own. At first, when a child leaves home to go to college, to get married or to take a job elsewhere, we are often left with a restless heartache that leaves us feeling empty.

But, after awhile, especially when our child, in the full bloom of adulthood, comes back to visit us, our heartache can just as quickly disappear because our loved one, now no longer a child, can offer us a richer love and presence than he or she could when they were little.

The pain of losing someone turns into the joy of finding something deeper in the one whom we thought we had lost. When Jesus was preparing his disciples for his ascension, he told them: "It is better for you that I go away. You won't understand this now. You will grieve and have heavy hearts, but, later, this will turn to joy and you will understand why I have to do this because, unless I go away, I can't send you my spirit."

> It's about the mystery of saying goodbye, when goodbye isn't really goodbye at all, but only love's way of taking on a different modality so that it can be present in a way that's deeper, purer, more permanent, less-clinging and less-limited by the tensions, disappointments, inadequacies, wounds and betrayals that, this side of eternity, forever make our intimacy a work in progress.

Here is some information about the composer off the Oregon catholic Press website:

John Schiavone has served as a parish priest for over 37 years in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, taking a full and active part in parish life. A source of his musical inspiration has always been the liturgical life of the Church, at which he regularly presides and preaches.

John builds his melodies along the lines and modes of Gregorian chant. "I want to keep that 'church' sound in my music and, at the same time make it accessible to the average worshiper," he says. His bilingual English/Spanish pieces are often used at diocesan celebrations across the country, especially the communion hymn "Amén. El Cuerpo de Cristo," which was included in the program for the Mass at Yankee Stadium celebrated by Pope Benedict XVI during his pastoral visit to New York in 2008.

John served for 12 years as pastor at St. Gregory the Great Parish in Whittier, California. He has recently begun a new assignment as pastor at St. Maria Goretti Parish in Long Beach, California.
