

What's gotten into you?" This question usually stems from unacceptable behav- The list goes on. ior. But it is an appropriate question for today's feast. The very people who for days, even weeks, had hidden themselves

in fear for their lives, were out and about and acting in astonishing ways. They no longer lived in secret. In fact, they were calling attention to themselves by their behavior. What had gotten into them?

"They were all filled with the Holy Spirit." It is such a simple statement, a statement that may no longer startle us! These previously terrified people were all filled with the dynamic power of God-the heals; the power so eloquently acclaimed in today's sequence. This Spirit burned within them like tongues of fire, and they went forth and proclaimed the message of God's love manifested in the resurrection of us that we will never be alone, even in the darkest Jesus.

So we review the deeds with each Candidate:

- greeting parishioners coming to weekend liturgies,

- decorating the church for Christmas or Easter,

- shoveling snow for elderly neighbors,
- cleaning the house for an ill mother,
- encouraging a depressed friend,
- babysitting a neighbors child for no charge,

Candidates realize that these wonderful acts of service provide positive feelings of self-affirmation as well make a difference in the lives of someone else. Some of them understand that they have the "power within" to do great things, to serve others' needs, and to do God's work in their world.

What is the source of this power? Baptism. The gift of God's eternal life. The presence of God, the Holy Spirit.



Today is Pentecost Sunday, also sometimes called the birthday of the Church. The apostles received the Holy Spirit and began spreading the Good News of Jesus' life and Resurrection on that day. It is good to remember that the church begins when the spirit is received. While we are a human institution with many faults, we as a church are guided by the Holy Spirit. We visit many families who were self sustaining until a sudden lay-off disrupted the family finances. The primary "bread winners" in these families want to work and are qualified to hold a variety of positions. It is very sad to see their frustration as application after application is denied.

One of the primary goals of SVDP is to prevent homelessness; so we have decided to join in the efforts of our families to search for employment by periodically offering their resumes to parishioners with the hope that one of you might be in a position to consider their applications.

Currently, we are assisting a single mom with two children who is looking for a position in Retail/Restaurant Management. She has 18 years of management experience. We also have a single woman who has a degree from Eastern Michigan University. She has 8 years experience as an executive secretary for a major company and is looking for a similar administrative position. Her resume is available for your review at our SJN Office.


