## FAITH WORKS

What’s gotten into you?” This question usually stems from unacceptable behavior. But it is an appropriate question for today’s feast. The very people who for days, even weeks, had hidden themselves in fear for their lives, were out and about and acting in astonishing ways. They no longer lived in secret. In fact, they were calling attention to themselves by their behavior. What had gotten into them?

“They were all filled with the Holy Spirit.” It is such a simple statement, a statement that may no longer startle us! These previously terrified people were all filled with the dynamic power of God—the power that refreshes and recreates, that comforts and heals; the power so eloquently acclaimed in today’s sequence. This Spirit burned within them like tongues of fire, and they went forth and proclaimed the message of God’s love manifested in the resurrection of Jesus.

This same Spirit was given to us when we were baptized into the death and resurrection of Jesus and confirmed in the power of the Spirit. If we received the same Spirit as did the disciples on that first Pentecost, why can’t we do the same marvelous deeds?

But we can.

One of the questions we ask candidates for the Sacrament of Confirmation is, “Why do you think we ask you to do Christian service deeds?”

Most candidates are thirteen or fourteen years old. They have all they can to complete the requirements for Confirmation Preparation, school and the onslaught of adolescence. They tend to focus on the “what” of the requirements, not the “why.”

So we review the deeds with each Candidate:

- greeting parishioners coming to weekend liturgies,
- serving at one of the Lenten Soup Suppers,
- decorating the church for Christmas or Easter,
- tutoring classmates,
- fund-raising for the homeless,
- shoveling snow for elderly neighbors,
- cleaning the house for an ill mother,
- encouraging a depressed friend,
- babysitting a neighbors child for no charge,

- reminding the family about Sunday Mass.

The list goes on.

Candidates realize that these wonderful acts of service provide positive feelings of self-affirmation as well make a difference in the lives of someone else. Some of them understand that they have the “power within” to do great things, to serve others’ needs, and to do God’s work in their world.

What is the source of this power? Baptism. The gift of God’s eternal life. The presence of God, the Holy Spirit.

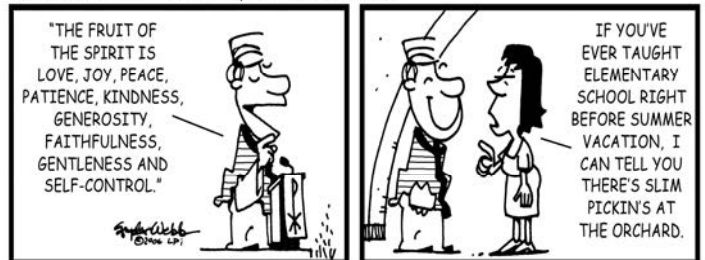
To be aware of God’s continuous presence in us, with us brings incredible energy and overwhelming gratitude. God’s promise to be with at all times, in all places - without exception - brings wisdom, understanding, courage, insight. It’s a promise that assures us that we will never be alone, even in the darkest times of our lives. What courage it brings to believe that there is nothing so painful or so scary, that it will destroy us. Whatever our trials, all will be okay in the end because God is always there.

That’s what got into the disciples at Pentecost - the assurance of God’s presence. That’s what gets into us at Baptism, at Confirmation and at every Eucharist.

It’s important for us to talk about how God is part of our lives, that God is part of our lives. By talking about God in our lives, we become more aware, more sensitive to the reality. My granddaughter, Klara, knows to tell us: “God is in my heart; he’s in your heart too, Dziadzia.”

Realizing God’s continuous presence will change our lives. On this Feast of Pentecost, let us pray for grace to let go of our insecurity and a willingness to open our heart to God, the Holy Spirit.

One of the primary goals of SVDP is to prevent homelessness; so we have decided to join in the efforts of our families to search for employment by periodically offering their resumes to parishioners with the hope that one of you might be in a position to consider their applications.

Currently, we are assisting a single mom with two children who is looking for a position in Retail/Restaurant Management. She has 18 years of management experience. We also have a single woman who has a degree from Eastern Michigan University. She has 8 years experience as an executive secretary for a major company and is looking for a similar administrative position. Her resume is available for your review at our SJN Office.
