Hello to you all

Well I am not around this weekend. As I let you know last week, I was headed out of town to a Dude Ranch in Montana! Oh the peace of no cell phone usage! Anyway, since I am gone, I thought I would share a few thoughts here on the readings for the weekend.

The crowds followed Jesus and his disciples even when what Jesus and his friends needed most was solitude. Jesus said they were sheep without a shepherd. So, with a great deal of compassion, he fed them what they needed to know to have eternal life—a life where they would never be hungry again. Our children look to us with the same hunger and eagerness as the crowd did in today's gospel. Like Jesus, we can change the shape of our children's lives with our example and words to live by.

I have spoken a lot in the past couple months on our reverence to the Eucharist, especially at mass. When we show a lack of reverence, whether we have children or not, the children see this and learn from that, so it should be no surprise if a young person is casual around the Eucharist, they were taught to be that way by us.

As most of you know, back in February we began all day Eucharistic adoration on Friday's from 9:30 am to 6:30 pm. Granted this time is difficult for people with children especially during the school year, but what a great way for you as a family to show your child the love we have for our Lord by being in his presence in prayer. Even during the school year, though the day time is difficult you could come with the family for the Benediction and Reposition of the Eucharist at 6:30 in the evening.

You see a sign outside the Church doors every weekend to sign up for a time to sit in prayer with our Lord on Fridays. I highly encourage you to make this a part of your prayer life. I ask if possible to sign up for a slot to pray and be with our Lord. Even if you cannot sign up, I still ask you to come on by and spend some time with Jesus on Fridays. If you can spend mindless time in front of a TV or computer screen, can't you give Christ a little time in prayer? I promise, you will gain more in your life spending time in the presence of Jesus than anything else you do on a Friday between the hours of 9:30 AM and 6:30 PM. Again showing our children a GREAT LOVE FOR CHRIST.

Lastly a few more thoughts to ponder on Sundays readings as you drive home:

Why does Jesus enter the world?
How do you complete His mission?
When do you spread His Word?
Where is His mission?

"By doing things as Jesus would do them, as God would do them, you free God from the veils of invisibility and make Him visible on Man's journey. Faith is an act, not a series of idle remarks. Hope is an undertaking bathed in light, not a pious sentiment. Charity is an event, not a devotional little prayer." (Carretto, Carlos, *The Desert in the City*)

FAITH WORKS

In first-century Palestine, there were only 3 or 4 large cities like Jerusalem. Ninety-percent of the population lived outside the large cities in villages with a

small number of residents. The population of Nazareth was probably no more than 150 and could have been as small as 50. Everybody minded everybody else's business. Privacy is practically non-existent. Rest was all but impossible. If someone was eating, it would be impolite and inconsiderate not to share with others.

There was a significant distance between these settlements. This uninhabited space was generally viewed as chaos or a lonely place. The modern experience of a family picnic in the park could not occur in Jesus' world.

Western readers, given to fast-food options and the tendency to eat on the run, may overlook the significance of Jesus' remark about no leisure, even to eat. All meals in the Mediterranean world are leisurely events. Even more importantly than nourishment, meals provide opportunities for strengthening personal bonds between those at the table. Since the disciples were away from Jesus for awhile, it was important to renew the bonds between them. It was quite likely that Jesus and the Twelve took food with them which they could not eat in his neighborhood.

The crowds gave Jesus and his followers no rest. They ran ahead to the boat's landing place even before the vessel arrived. Jesus' response to them was compassion because they were like sheep without a shep-

herd. Sheep are basically dumb animals. No one can lead them; they need to be driven. Without a shepherd, sheep simply lie down and move ahead. Jesus perceived that the people had basic needs that were unmet.

Jesus taught them well enough to keep them there late in the day - in a lonely place, without provisions. Everyone wondered what was next. The story continues for the next few weeks.

Allison Schmitt, daughter of long time parishioners Ralph and Gail Schmitt, and siblings of Kirsten, Derek, Sara and Kari, will be leading the charge for the USA swim team in this years 2012 summer Olympic games being held in London. Allison, a graduate of Canton High School where she was named the 2008 Michigan High School Female athlete of the year and a 5 time NCAA Individual champion (University of Georgia), will be competing in her second Olympic games. She won bronze in the 2008 games as a member of the 4x 200 free style relay team. At the recently held 2012 Olympic trails in Nebraska, Allison turned in a record breaking performance. She won both the 200m and 400m freestyle. In the 200, Allison swam the fastest time recorded in the world this year, clocking in at 1:54.40. This time also beat her own American record!
