Hello everyone!

Jesus created a lot of excitement and enthusiasm among the people who came to hear his words. It is clear, however, that they did not completely understand the meaning of what he said. They looked for signs and believed that he performed miracles such as the one in today's gospel. This gospel tells of the fishes and loaves of bread multiplied to such an extent that they not only fed the large crowd, but there was plenty of food left over. The people simply saw the amount of bread increase in a way similar to God providing food for the ancient Israelites when he sent manna from heaven to fill their hunger. The people on the hillside with Jesus did not understand how bread could be spiritual nourishment or that Jesus was that bread.

As a family I ask you to reflect on the following:

So much of our culture today is based on a "what's in it for me" attitude. We are reluctant to give our time, energy, or resources to an effort that doesn't yield a benefit directly for us or our families. Our simple acts of kindness toward others do not go unnoticed by our children. When they see us give of ourselves generously, they learn about the boy who shared his food with the crowd in today's gospel.

I guess when I speak to you all about stewardship, I am not talking about financial stewardship, though that is important I am speaking to you of your TIME and TALENTS as well. Most of us who come to mass do nothing more than come to mass. I am not saying that is a bad thing—I am HAPPY you show up, that is the MOST important; however, we should also offer our TIME and TALENT to the parish as well. When we as adults choose not to give in this way are we not teaching our children that it is ok not to give of ones self in the service of others, and more importantly, in service to God.

The norm in any parish is that it is a small percentage of people who give of themselves in service, and it is the same people over and over again. I think that is sad. I am not discounting that most of us have very busy lives, that is a given for us all. However, when we let that come before aiding God in his mission maybe we need to do some reflection.

I address this to all of the parishioners here at St. John Neumann, as we are always in need of more ministers in every capacity. When I say more, I mean we need to DOUBLE what we have, if not more than that.

On what was said above, a personal thing to the Sunday evening 5:30 mass crowd. Many of you are regulars to that mass and you have all heard me over the past couple years express the need for you to volunteer in service to that mass. I first want to thank those of you who have done so. Your work in the ministerial areas has been tremendous. However we still need a lot of help from other people. As you all know, we no longer have an associate at the parish, which means we will have visiting priests celebrating the mass on a regular basis. That is not a problem when we have people here to fill all the ministries and so on. However when we do not, as was the case a couple weeks ago when I was the celebrant, basic things for the mass would not have happened had it been another priest here. The reason, not only does he not have the knowledge of where anything is he also does not know the people. And to be honest, a visiting priest coming in to help us out should not have to worry about those things.

When it was I or Fr. Mark celebrating the mass, something going awry was still a concern but not a major one, now it is a major concern.

With only one priest at the parish our need for you, the parishioners faithful to the 5:30 mass, to step up as a collective group is not a desire but a must. Without your help on a continued, regular, guaranteed basis, I cannot be assured things are running smoothly for the mass when I am not present.

So the ball is in your court to come up with a solution to assure that things will run smoothly. This is a situation that I am going to address seriously with the Worship Commission at our first meeting in September because, to be honest, at this point I am at somewhat of a loss and I cannot do this one without your help.

I thank you for your patience and serious prayer and thoughts in this matter.

FAITH WORKS

Is it a gift or a right? We Americans seem to work harder to gain the good things in life. Yet, if we were asked what we cherish the most, we would point to those things that cannot be earned. Ultimately, the question of falls to the our inner character. Are we self-giving or self centered?

Jesus presented such a choice to crowd he fed with bread and fish. He gave them a sign. But was it a sign of faith or a sign of birthright?

Sometimes we confuse God's blessing with faith: we assume abundance is the sign of God's favor. This sets up a vicious cycle of greed. The little we have is not enough; we want more. And we rationalize this greed in the name of God.

The signs, the time, and the place seemed perfect for a miracle. The signs were Jesus' cures. The time was spring, close to Passover, the feast of liberation from slavery. The place was a mountain in the desert; on such a mountain, God gave the Law to Moses and revealed his power.

Expecting an experience like their ancestors of the Exodus, the people followed Jesus. And Jesus did not disappoint them. In the multiplication of the loaves and the fish, Jesus surpassed the two great prophets of Galilee, Elijah and Elisha. From a single basket of food, there were 12 baskets left over, a number that meant fulfillment. The time and the place were just right; the sign was from God. And, Jesus revealed himself as the Great Prophet.

The people fell to the temptation of greed; after they experience God's blessing, they wanted more. In the people's eyes, what Jesus did was sufficient to make

him the prophet-king of a country freed from Rome's dominance. So, they made their move, and Jesus fled.

The multiplication pointed to the Eucharist. From one body, God fed many and an abundance remained. One small piece of bread was broken and the result was eternal life. From the flesh of one man, the world was fed a gift!

How can we truly appreciate God's gifts to us? And, how do we resist the temptation to demand more from God?

When we are dismissed at the end of the Mass, it is the beginning of our mission to do the work of Jesus. With this in mind our Summer project has 2 parts:

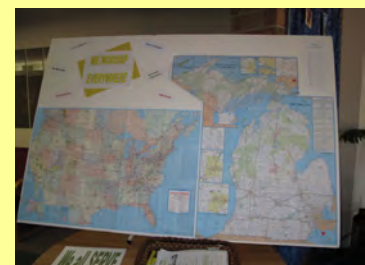

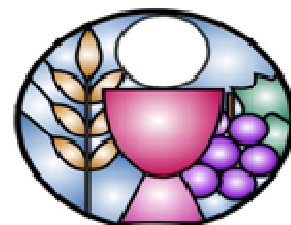
