

Bartholomew, apostle

This week, on Friday, August 24 as Catholics we celebrate the feast of Bartholomew- one of the 12 apostles. Apart from being listed among the Twelve, Bartholomew appears as one of the witnesses of the Ascension (Acts 1:4, 12, 13). We have 1 church in the Archdiocese of Detroit dedicated to this Saint- it was founded in 1925 in the 8-mile/I-75 area of Detroit on East Outer Drive.

Bartholomew was from Cana, in Galilee, who some scholars believe to be also called Nathaniel (John 1:45). He preached the gospel in India & Armenia and converted great numbers to Christ. In the end he was cruelly tormented, flayed (Skinned) alive, and then beheaded by Astyages. Because of responses to intercessory prayers made to him, he became well known as a healer during the Middle Ages- many hospitals have been named after him (e.g.- St. Bartholomew's Hospital in London).

In Rome, there is an island in the Tiber River, called Tiber Island, which was the site of an ancient temple to Aesculapius, the Greek god of medicine and healing (the staff of Aesculapius is used as the symbol of medicine in the today). A basilica for St. Bartholomew was built on the site of that temple in the year 998 by Emperor Otto III and is known as San Bartolomeo all'Isola (St. Bartholomew-on-the-Island). It is believed that there was a spring of sacred waters at the ancient temple.

Are we today here in Canton Michigan apostles for Christ? The definition of an apostle is: One sent as an envoy or messenger. Bartholomew's friend Philip brought him to Jesus. I know a priest who in his funeral homilies puts it this way: I think when we get to heaven God will ask us 2 questions: Do you love me & who did you bring with you?

These past few weeks we have heard from the book of John. This week, we hear Jesus tell the crowds, "Amen, amen I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day." I wonder if I was in the crowd at that time would I truly understand what Jesus was saying. Today, sometimes it is hard for people to truly "get" it.

We travel all over to different cities, and towns to get a glimpse of celebrities and artists in concerts, plays, movies, etc. What would happen if Jesus came into the world right now? Would people go to great lengths to see him? What lengths would you go just to set eyes on him for a second? Perhaps someone famous has visited your city or town, and you have a sense of what happens. We can only imagine that it would be just like that times a thousand if Jesus were to come. In July 2010 I was given the opportunity to go on a pilgrimage to El Salvador with a local group. I was hesitant to go and unsure of what I would experience. I am so happy that I took the leap of faith and went with my daughter Carly to show solidarity with the people in the rural communities outside of Suchitoto.



One of the places we visited was La Mora Medical Clinic. This clinic has been supported by the generosity and fundraising efforts of Resurrection Parish in Canton since 2005. We took a tour of this small, rural clinic which provides access to medical care to approximately 25,000 impoverished people and met one of the doctors and the nurse who work there. Without this clinic and the funding by Resurrection Parish, these people would not have medical treatment without traveling a great distance.



When we came home from this life-changing week, my daughter and I wanted to help the people and the communities that we had visited. The people we met feel like family to us now and we hope that you will help support them now. Our parish's summer project is to do the work of Jesus and I have a suggestion for you to do just that. 
