Hello all!

Well here we are the FINAL weekend of August and we are having the parish picnic! I would so like to say "Oh what awesome weather we are having for the picnic," but given I am writing this article on Monday, I have no idea what the weather will be like! Hopefully good!

Well this past Friday was the Feast of St. Bartholomew, one of the twelve Apostles. Not much is known about Bartholomew, but scripture scholars believe he is Nathaniel who appears in the first chapter of John. (John 1:45-51; 21:2).

Since not much is mentioned of him, very little is known, but his manner of death has taken on a couple of possibilities. Some believe he was beheaded, others say he was flayed alive and crucified, head downward. Because of the latter legend of his death, he is often depicted in art as flayed and holding in his hand his own skin.

On another note take this tidbits home with you while reflecting on this week's readings:

Pick a verse or phrase from today's scripture. Keep the phrase close to your heart. Be quiet and rest in the peace found in His Word.

Keep the scripture you have chosen in focus. Leave all other thoughts and activities behind for five minutes. Be open to God's presence.

How do you become one with Jesus?

"It is the Spirit of God that must teach us who Christ is and form Christ in us and transform us into other Christs. After all, transformation into Christ is not just an individual affair: there is only one Christ, not many. He is not divided. And for me to become Christ is to enter into the Life of the Whole Christ, the Mystical Body made up of the Head and the members, Christ and all who are incorporated in Him by the His Spirit." (Thomas Merton – *New Seeds of Contemplation*)

In fact, these changes can be for us moments of transformation, just like the change that transforms a caterpillar into a butterfly.

Our retreat will lead us to reflect on how we respond to change in faith, and how we might even be called to enter into change, so that we may become more and like the Son of God, Jesus Christ, who underwent various changes in order to bring us to salvation. Instead of resisting change, we may find ourselves willing to "keep" it.

In July 2010 I was given the opportunity to go on a pilgrimage to El Salvador with a local group. I was hesitant to go and unsure of what I would experience. I am so happy that I took the leap of faith and went with my daughter Carly to show solidarity with the people in the rural communities outside of Suchitoto.

One of the places we visited was La Mora Medical Clinic. This clinic has been supported by the generosity and fundraising efforts of Resurrection Parish in Canton since 2005. We took a tour of this small, rural clinic which provides access to medical care to approximately 25,000 impoverished people and met one of the doctors and the nurse who work there. Without this clinic and the funding by Resurrection Parish, these people would not have medical treatment without traveling a great distance.

When we came home from this life-changing week, my daughter and I wanted to help the people and the communities that we had visited. The people we met feel like family to us now and we hope that you will help support them now. Our parish's summer project is to do the work of Jesus and I have a suggestion for you to do just that. Resurrection Parish will be having their annual Wine Tasting/Silent Auction here at St. John Neumann on Friday, September 28th at 7:30 p.m. I hope that you will join me at this fundraiser to benefit the clinic and my extended family in El Salvador. 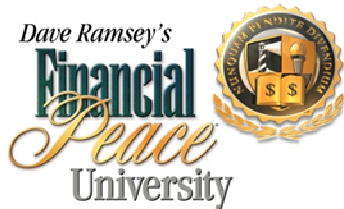

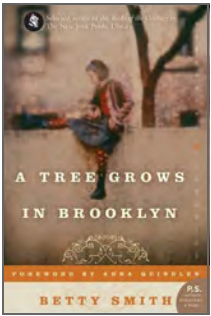
