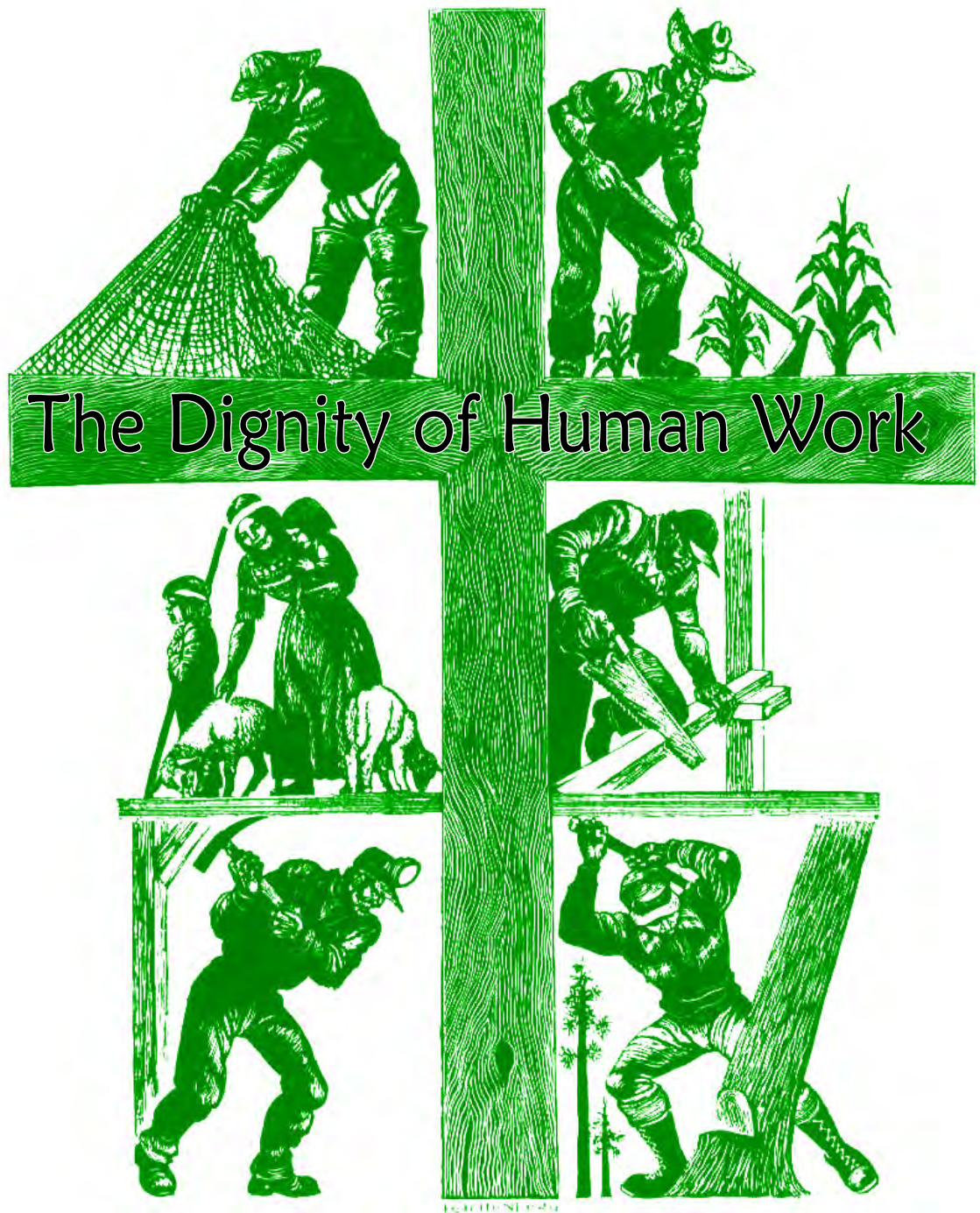

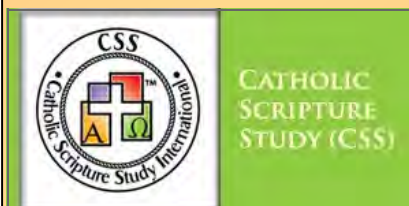

Gospel Reflection... Rules, Rules, Rules... In the time of Jesus, as in our time today, people had a lot of rules determining what behavior was socially acceptable. In the time of Jesus, the Jewish people followed the Ten Commandments, but they also followed a lot of rules that they have made up themselves. Over and over again in the Gospel, Jesus scandalizes the people by doing things that they thought were wrong according to their faith, like talking to tax collectors, caring for lepers, and, in this Gospel eating with unclean hands. Jesus calls them to look at their lives with the eyes of God, not with human eyes. Even though hand washing was a big deal, God never said anything about it. In your life, there are probably a lot of people who are trying to get you to act a certain way or to do certain things. Sometimes, it can be really hard to know what's best. When making hard decisions, spend time in prayer discerning what it is that God wants you to do, separating it from what other people want you to do. This week in prayer, ask God to help you notice and choose his commandments in all of your decisions, big and small.

I would like to close today with a special prayer; I came across this prayer in my readings this week. Sometimes we read, attend classes and conferences to be refreshed and get the strength to make a difference.

It seems after attending "all these things" we somehow become exhausted to live out the mission. Hopefully this prayer will help us all. This prayer comes from Fr. Satish Joseph.

## Prayer for the Grace of Discipleship

God our Father, Your Son Jesus called his disciples and said, "You did not choose me, but I chose you." You have chosen me to be today's disciple in today's world. I thank you that you consider me worthy to be a disciple of Jesus. Transform me Father, into the image of Jesus.

Make my heart long for you in poverty of spirit. Make my heart mourn at the misfortune of others. Make me meek and humble of heart. Make me hunger and thirst for what is right. Make me merciful and overflowing with compassion. Make me clean of heart and share in your holiness. Make my life an instrument of peace and reconciliation. In July 2010 I was given the opportunity to go on a pilgrimage to El Salvador with a local group. I was hesitant to go and unsure of what I would experience. One of the places we visited was La Mora Medical Clinic. This clinic has been supported by the generosity and fundraising efforts of Resurrection Parish in Canton since 2005. We took a tour of this small, rural clinic which provides access to medical care to approximately 25,000 impoverished people and met one of the doctors and the nurse who work there. Without this clinic and the funding by Resurrection Parish, these people would not have medical treatment without traveling a great distance.

When we came home from this life-changing week, my daughter and I wanted to help the people and the communities that we had visited. The people we met feel like family to us now and we hope that you will help support them now. Our parish's summer project is to do the work of Jesus and I have a suggestion for you to do just that. 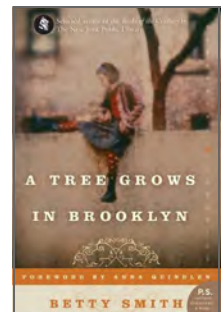

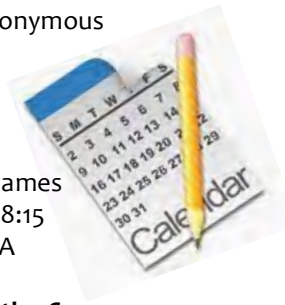
