Hello to you all!

About 6 weeks ago I wrote an article that contained a request for the 5:30 Sunday Evening mass. I am republishing that article here as I feel it is important to the Sunday evening 5:30 mass crowd!

Many of you are regulars to that mass and you have all heard me over the past couple years express the need for you to volunteer in service to that mass. I first want to thank those of you who have done so. Your work in the ministerial areas has been tremendous. However, we still need a lot of help from other people.

As you all know we no longer have an associate at the parish, which means we will have visiting priests celebrating the mass on a regular basis. That is not a problem when we have people here to fill all the ministries and so on. However when we do not, as has been the case on many occasions when I have been the celebrant, basic things for the mass would not have happened had it been another priest here. The reason, not only does he (another celebrant) not have the knowledge of where anything is located, he also does not know the people. And to be honest a visiting priest coming in to help us out should not have to worry about those things.

When it was I or Fr. Mark celebrating the mass, something going awry was still a concern but not a major one, now it is a major concern.

With only one priest at the parish our need for you, the parishioners faithful to the 5:30 mass, to step up as a collective group. It is not a desire but a must. Without your help on a continued, regular, guaranteed basis, I cannot be assured things are running smoothly for the mass when I am not present.

So the ball is in your court to come up with a solution to assure that things will run smoothly. This is a situation that I am going to address seriously with the Worship Commission at our first meeting on September 18 because, to be honest at this point I am at somewhat of a loss and I cannot do this one without your help

I thank you for your patience, and serious prayer and thoughts, in this matter!

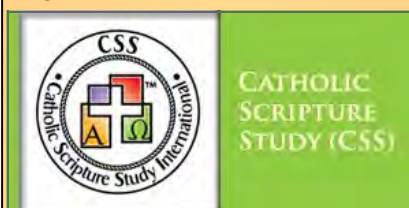

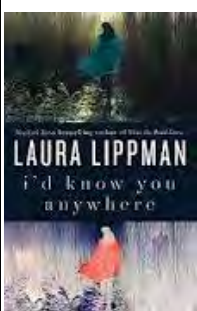


Cucchi's Corner

In today's Gospel (Mark 7: 31-37) Mark tells us the story of a deaf man, who has a speech impediment, being brought to Jesus by people who apparently cared about him. Jesus took him aside and prayed that he "Be opened." Immediately the man could hear and he was able to speak clearly.

We too bring each other to Jesus to be healed, We bring our children, older family members and even ourselves, asking that our ears would be opened to hear the truth of God's Word. The hope is that having heard this truth, we would be able to tell others about it.

We might ask ourselves, how has the Word of God that we hear at Mass and throughout our lives opened our ears and helped us to be rich in faith so that we can speak of the wonderful things God has done for us?

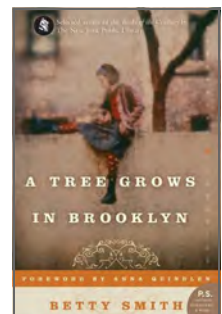

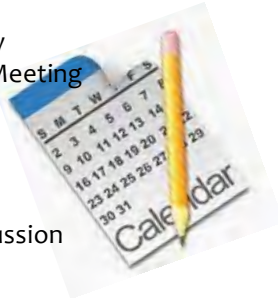
