Hello all -

STEWARDSHIP - meaning Time and Talent in this case!- is a huge thing in the functioning of any parish in many, many capacities! In fact we are beginning a Stewardship Commission at the parish and in the near future you will be hearing from them in regards to this area. However, I wanted to approach a few areas of importance in the mass itself where needs are always existing-

EME's, Lectors, Alter Servers/Mass Helpers, Sacristans, Choir, Media and Ushers

All of these areas are always in great need of help at all the masses, and your active participation in these areas help out immensely.

EME's or Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist!: In most of our masses we have, counting myself, 14 people distributing the body and blood- we would like to have 16; however, because we do not have enough people signed up to volunteer for this ministry we cannot! Also we do not want people serving in this capacity every week so we need a lot of people signed up so we can rotate people in and out on a regular basis!

Lectors: We use two lectors for every mass. Again, the more we have the more we can rotate people throughout the course of the year so they are not serving every single week.

Ushers: Well it is pretty obvious what those ushers are doing. What a great ministry to be involved in-you get to greet the people as they arrive and leave, as well as many other areas of the mass. Sometimes people think this is a Man thing. Well it is not, we need WOMEN AND MEN both young and older!

Sacristans: The set up and clean up from every mass is vital, getting the host ready along with the chalice, as well as cleaning the vessels after mass.!!! This is 'behind the scenes' work that is very fulfilling.

Media: This helps us run the power point during the mass, aiding you as the parishioners to follow more closely what is going on.

Choir: Without music, liturgy is not liturgy and we need both MEN AND WOMEN! If you think you cannot sing, YOU ARE WRONG. Having every choir seat full for the mass lends to beautiful prayer!

Alter Servers/Mass Helpers: This is a great opportunity for young people to be involved in the mass. We take kids as young as 4th grade. It is a great ministry for them and NECESSARY. Parents, what a great way for you to teach your child about what goes on in the mass. You are here - allow your children to learn the sharing of their Time and Talent is important as well,!

WE NEED PEOPLE IN ALL OF THESE MINISTRIES OF OUR MASS! It is only through your willingness to step forward that we are able to have a prayerful liturgy.

I know it is easier if I come up to you individually and ask you to do these things, so consider this your INDIVIDUAL invitation! Accept it and call the office to let us know

Alleluia from the Jubilation Mass By Fr. James Chepponis

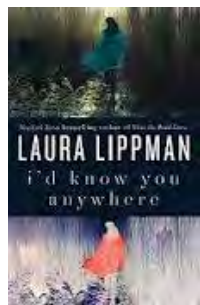
During September we have been singing the Alleluia by Fr. Jim Chepponis of the Diocese of Pittsburgh. The Alleluia is part of *Jubilation Mass*. Fr. Chepponis explains in the front cover of the Mass: *Jubilation Mass was written over a ten-year period. It was begun in 1987 and was expanded, tested, and altered until written down in final form in 1999.*

Fr. Chepponis is a widely published composer. Since 1996, Fr. Jim has served the Diocese of Pittsburgh as Director of the Office for Music Ministry, and his work includes providing music for all Diocesan liturgies, directing the Diocesan Choirs and serving as a music resource person for parishes throughout the city. In July of 2003, Fr. Chepponis was also appointed as pastor of St. John Capistran Parish in the Upper St. Clair, suburb of Pittsburgh. His published articles on music/liturgy have appeared in liturgy periodicals.

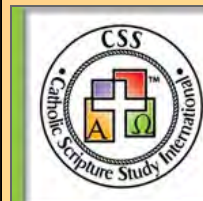

FAITH WORKS

FAITH does not arise as a response to something coming out of the stars, so to speak, and then authenticated by the Church. Neither does it spring solely from the well-springs of the heart.

Revelation, or God's self-disclosure, occurs in the ordinary experiences of life.

For the Christian, Jesus Christ is the personification of that revelation and of God's benevolent intentions toward us. However, the Gospel is believable only if it actually helps us to explain and enrich the ordinary experiences of life: whether loving relationships, on the one hand, or tragic misfortunes, on the other.

In other words, we do not have faith because someone in authority or some book tells us to have faith. We have faith because it illuminates and gives deeper meaning to the ordinary experiences of life.

Christian faith is a virtue by which we freely accept God's self-communication in Jesus Christ. Catholic faith is simply Christian faith as embraced and lived out in the faith-community known as the Catholic Church.

We believe in the Gospel of Jesus Christ because it helps us to explain and even to enrich our experience of ourselves, of others, of the world around us, and of human history itself. The Gospel leads us to a greater self-awareness as human persons, to a deeper union with others, to a more profound commitment to the needs of others, and to confidence and hope in the meaningfulness of life and the happy outcome of human history.

If Jesus Christ and his message of salvation did not do that for us, if they did not help us make sense of who we are and of our destiny, we would not become Christian or remain Christian--at least not a faith-filled, committed Christian.

Faith, however, is not a once-and-for-all gift from God, by which we have the "power" (Latin, *virtus*) to believe in God and in Jesus as the Christ. Faith is a gift to be cultivated, nurtured, and increased the gospel story (Matthew 25:14-30).

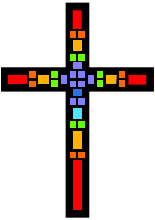

In today's Gospel (Mark 8: 27-35) Jesus teaches us, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it."



The cross is an important symbol for us as Catholics. This gospel story might be a great opportunity to reflect on why the cross is an important symbol for us. Then we might discuss our reflections with our children. In the story, Jesus tells the people that he must suffer greatly and be killed. We know that story. Jesus gave his life for us.

But then Jesus gives those who wish to follow him the real challenge. Those who wish to follow him (that would be us) must also give their life for others. If we want to be followers of Jesus we're suppose to sacrifice ourselves to help others. Sometimes times, many times, that is really, really hard. That's why the cross is our special symbol; it reminds us to be loving and helpful to others.

HIGH SCHOOL WITH MARY WILKERSON

"I gained confidence that I had never had before, for once I was comfortable just being me"

"Youth Group has allowed me to think about the things that really matter, things like faith and true friendships... it has made me stronger in those areas"

"It is hard to find TRUE friends, people that won't hurt you, youth ministry was the place for me to go to get that"

"The meetings were unexpected, I learn a lot but really have a good time participating"

"I didn't expect that youth group would come to mean so much to me, but it has"

These are just some of the answers the young people gave. I'm not naïve, I know that hanging out at Church might not be the first thing that comes to your mind when you think about what you want to do with your free time. But, if you are a 9th-12 grader, I really encourage you to give it a shot. If you are a parent of a 9th-12th grader, I really encourage you to ask your sons/daughters to attend at least 3 of our youth group meetings. No, youth group is not for everyone, but I firmly believe that most young people can benefit highly from being involved in a Catholic Church Youth Program!

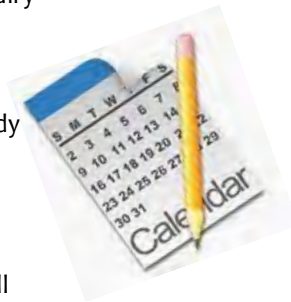
