

IT'S MY OPINION AND I HAVE ONE!

Hello to you all!

I hope this week has found you all well!

First I want to let the 5:30 mass crowd know that at the end of mass next week we are going to have a meeting immediately after the mass ends right inside the body of the church to discuss the mass. As you know, over the two and a half years I have been here I have made several appeals to all of you, included two articles I wrote this past summer, one in July and the other in September. I am taking the time after mass on Sunday the 28th to further discuss this situation. So there will be no recessional hymn on that day when the 5;30 mass comes to a close.

On a spiritual note, as you head home this weekend from the liturgy I ask you to reflect on the following from what you experienced in the mass:

How do you serve the community around you?

How do you reflect Christian values in your life regardless of the cost?

How are you a servant to the most vulnerable?

How do you model Christian values that conflict with secular values?

From who I think may have been the greatest Theologian of the 20th century Avery Cardinal Dulles:

"The Church's mission, in the perspective of this theology (church as servant), is not primarily to gain new recruits for its own ranks, but rather to be of help to all men, wherever they are. The special competence of the Church is to keep alive the hope and aspiration of men for the Kingdom of God and its values. In the light of this hope the Church is able to discern the signs of the times and to offer guidance and prophetic criticism. In this way the church promotes the mutual reconciliation of men and initiates them in various ways into the Kingdom of God." (Dulles, Avery Cardinal, *Models of the Church*)

does the actor seek fame in Hollywood or on Broadway? Why does the business person seek wealth or the climb up the corporate ladder? Why does the person of faith seek a position of ministry?

bition in any of these fields. In fact, most people use ambition to better themselves and their surroundings. But the question must be asked: why do they seek? Do they want to wealth and fame and power urgy, consider moving to Formation, Christian Serfor themselves alone? Or do they want to use these ambitions for the greater good? These were the questions Jesus asked his followers when the subject of

ambition raised its head among the Apostles.

Jesus rejected a leadership of power but pointed to a leadership of service. He uses the image of the servant/waiter at a dinner to make his point. At the banquet of God's kingdom, it was not the person who passed the cup that was important; it was the one who took the order. Referring to the "Son of Man" image, Jesus saw himself on the cross as the primary model for "servant leadership."

Think of waiters or waitresses in our own culture. A good waiter or waitress must be part entertainer (making good "small talk") when the order is placed, timely provider of food and drink, and invisible guide, ever to provide assistance, yet at a discrete distance. They are to leave us alone when we desire privacy, but approach immediately when we need help. They are to serve us and, in doing so, they lead us through the meal.

Jesus fits the waiter/servant role perfectly. He leads by serving us; even though he seems distant, he is ever present to help. As Christians, we are to lead others in the same way, with tact and quiet guidance, by moral example and moral commitment. Such leadership leads to the cross. But it also leads to resurrection.





NEXT WEEK Sixth Week of Class Confirmation Prep: Fall Fiesta: Monday, 7:30 p.m. In today's Gospel story (Mark 10: 35-45) some of the apostles are asking Jesus to have a place of honor in the kingdom or perhaps a place of authority. Jesus points out that for people who follow him, being great means the opposite of being great in other situations. For followers of Jesus, Christians, being great means being a servant to the others. He emphasizes this and says we need to be a slave to all.

Jesus explains that he himself did not come to be served but to serve us. He gave the ultimate in service. He gave his life for us.

What does what Jesus says in today's Gospel mean for us? What does being a servant mean at home? ...at school?...at work?...in our neighborhood?...in our parish?

This past week we began our Faith UNwrapped season for 2012-2013. The first session was entitled: <u>Opening the Window: A</u> Faith UNwrapped about the Vision of Vatican II. I hope you were able to join us. Vatican II began 50 years ago this month. And it is still affecting our lives today.

We talked about Pope John XXIII and why he called for the council and how he invited Bishops from all over the world to communicate their desires for the council. Pope John XXIII used an Italian word, "aggiornamento," which literally means "updating to today." "Aggiornamento" has come to signify throwing open the Church's windows to allow reform and freshness. Pope John wanted to reach out to today's needs, today's times, today's people and so the Council did. Join us in November to hear more about Vatican II.

Hello Fellow Parishioners,

We, the recently formed Saint Vincent de Paul Conference as part of the Christian Service efforts at SJN have just finished our third quarter in 2012. We have had a very active group thus far with 18 members joining as full or associate members. We are an all volunteer group supported by the church with meeting space and endorsement from the parish priest, Fr. Ron Richards. The committee has been lead since Sept. 2011 by Lorraine and Don Zaksek, (President and Treasure), and Gerry Gutkowski. (Vice President), and Daniel Faoro (Secretary). We have been blessed to be lead in Prayer by Deacon Pat (Spiritual advisor) at the start and close of our meetings.

We serve the poor after providing a thorough background check, a review of personal finances and financial budgeting, and assist them in procuring the social service benefits they are entitled to. Since July 1, 2012 we have provided \$10, 871.0 in support to respond to 44 individuals and their needs for assistance from families/individuals to prevent evictions, termination of utility services, meet medical needs, and provide emergency car repair, and food / household needs. In addition to the clothes and other donations to the SVdP store we receive the generous support from parishioners and outreach efforts, "Top Hat Sundays", and other parish fund raisers. We had a successful Friends of the Poor Walk/Run on_Saturday, September 29, 2012 and raised \$741, thank you for your support. Our scrip programs are going well and we raised \$395 this quarter from your participation in the Kroger and Holiday Market programs, enrollment forms are on the table outside of church for those who want to sign up. We recently registered SVdP for the Meijer's scrip program as well - see the Bulletin and SVdP website and information below for registration information.

This month we are applying for a United Way community assistance grant. We held our Bundle Days collection is on 10-6/7 -2012, thank you for your support. We will have a Membership Drive soon our members will speak about the conference activities on the 10-20-12. We will have a sign-up table after mass on 10-20/21st 2012., with a new member ship orientation meeting on 10-27-12 at 10.00AM at SJN.

Our members have attended numerous training sessions in the Detroit area to become familiar with skills to serve area residents, learn how to help families apply for social service programs, and state and federal assistance programs for the poor.

We meet at 7.00PM on the second Monday evening of the month in the SJN Youth room. We look forward to new members at varying levels and ability, full, associate, and our youth group.
