

IT'S MY OPINION AND I HAVE ONE!

Hello everyone!

Through the course of a few weekends I have asked people to look to different ministries that they possibly felt called to, in particular I brought up hospitality. Today I would like to look at the choir and the beauty of that ministry.

The main function of the choir is to lead and help the assembly sing. The choir animates and encourages the praise of God and assists the faithful to pray with joy, harmony, and beauty. The choir makes it possible for the entire assembly to sing praise to God.

Being a choir member is a call, a vocation that one has to discover, to nourish by purifying his intention to be a choir member. In the words of Vatican Council II, the primary ministry of the choir, and those who play various instruments, is to support and enhance the singing of all the faithful called to lift their voices in praise.

Knowing this, the more members we have in the choir the better our prayer in music will be. I know Rick is ALWAYS looking to get more people involved in the choir and have the chairs in the choir area full! Please call and talk to Rick about joining, even if you think you cannot sing good enough, that is just not true— you can!!!!

Also, I know there will be the children's choir starting up soon. We want to have a regular children's choir here at St. John Neumann, not just a Christmas thing! So we need to get your children involved. Please do not worry too much about age, call Rick and talk to him about that, he will let you know. The more our parish sees children involved with liturgy, the more that LIFE is brought to the parish, so please get your children involved in the children's choir!!!!

Lastly, today I want to let you all know what is going on with the 5:30 mass. As you know, a couple weeks ago I put forth a plea for help in ministries for this liturgy. The number I asked for, 36, was the bare minimum that we could work with for this mass to continue in the future. Well, after giving more than a week for people to step forward for the various ministries, we are still shy of what is necessary for the ministries to be covered in total. As a result, as I said to you at the end of mass, we will have to discontinue this mass beginning the first Sunday of Advent. So November 25th will be the last time we have a 5:30 liturgy.

To those of you who have been committed to helping out at this liturgy, I am sorry to do this, but I really do not see any other option. I do hope that you will continue to serve at the other liturgies we offer; your gifts of service are always needed and appreciated.





FAITH WORKS

God wants your friendship. And once you enter into friendship with God, everything in your life begins to change. As you come to know him better, you find you want to

reflect something of his infinite goodness in your own life. You are attracted to the practice of virtue. You begin to see greed and selfishness and all the other sins for what they really are, destructive and dangerous tendencies that cause deep suffering and do great damage, and you want to avoid falling into that trap yourselves. You begin to feel compassion for people in difficulties and you are eager to do something to help them. You want to come to the aid of the poor and the hungry, you want to comfort the sorrowful, you want to be kind and generous. And once these things begin to matter to you, you are well on the way to becoming saints."

SEVEN KEY ELEMENTS OF LAY SPIRITUALITY

1. First and most important is PRAYER. Prayer is talking over my life with God. The goal of all true prayer is to look at life with the eyes of God. Prayer attempts to make me patient with myself, compassionate toward others and peaceful most of all.

- 2. The second important aspect is INTIMACY. Intimacy means more than proximity; it means sharing the depths of self with another. To be intimate is to be completely honest about myself.
- 3. A third characteristic of Christian spirituality is FORGIVENESS. Forgiveness is not exclusively othercentered. Very often the hardest person to forgive is myself. There are only two practical methods for getting over my own blunders: forgetting and forgiving.
- 4. The fourth aspect of spirituality is WORK. For work to be truly Christian, the worker must be creative. One must try to bring order out of chaos. The creative worker is goal-oriented; not haphazard, sets aside time to think about the implications of one's work.
- 5. A fifth aspect of spirituality is HOSPITALITY. Hospitality is an attitude of attentiveness that makes the one encountered feel valued. By spending time with someone, listening to that person, I affirm that s/he is more than an object, rather a cherished member of the human community, instead of an intruder.

- 6. The sixth aspect of spirituality is NETWORKING, or forming associations in order to meet human needs. Networking counteracts the tendency to narcissism so prevalent in our society, by focusing attention away from self to the urgent needs of others.
- 7. **The seventh and last aspect of spirituality is PLAY.** Play is the imaginative construction of one segment of reality. Play is much more than diversion or exercise. It is creativity in preliminary form, the fore-runner of authentic change.

Play is creative time-wasting. It relativizes the tyranny of time and the dictatorship of duty. It introduces joy into the seriousness of reality. Play is important for the Christian because it requires a certain distancing from all that is usually considered important.

FAITH FORMATION

FUN sessions are happening this week!

All parishioners are invited to our November Faith Unwrapped which starts today, Sunday, November 11th. This year our Faith Unwrapped theme is the vision, the message, of Vatican II, which opened 50 years ago this Fall. Still today we are affected by this marvelous gathering of all the bishops of the world. We are encouraged to take the messages of Vatican 2 to heart.

At our October session we were reminded that Blessed Pope John XXIII called this council inviting all the Bishops of the world to attend. In referring to the purpose of the council Pope John used the Italian word, "aggiornamento," which means bring the Church up-to-date where needed in order to reach out to today's needs, today's times, today's people. To prepare for the council Pope John XXIII asked all the bishop to express what they saw as the most pressing issues for the Council to discuss to reach out to today's world. Over 2000 of the 2500+ bishops of the world responded to this request. At the October Faith UNwrapped we imagined what it would be like to be the bishops of the world suggesting ideas and concerns that the Church could work on to reach out to today's world. Some suggestions were:

Through charity work show the kindness of our Church; cooperate with people of different religions; consider using contemporary, upbeat music to encourage singing with one's whole heart; show empathy and live with gratitude for life's blessing; have a sitcom that shows Catholic values; make a Facebook page; bring the Gospel to familiar places; emphasize common belief and practices with other faiths; read and learn about the bible, reach out to the poor no matter what their faith, focus on younger generations (children & young adults); focus on family; spread the Word through actions; dialogue; nourish one another. Many more suggestions were made.



I found this quote in a book I am reading and it spoke to my soul. As many of you know, in the past 2.5 years, my husband and I have been blessed with two really fantastic children. Sometimes, it is crazy to think of how God is directing our lives and we are so psyched to be able to raise these little people to be saints. The call to parenthood is insanely wonderful; the call of being a mother is more powerful than I anticipated. When my oldest son, Aaron, was born, discernment began within our family regarding how I would be able to best meet the needs of my family. Youth Ministry has been my whole life. In many ways, I have grown up at Saint John Neumann these past nine years as the Coordinator of Youth Ministry, but God has made it abundantly clear that it is now time for me to step back and transition to be a full time stay at home mom.

This was a decision that came with a lot of prayer and I feel so blessed to work for a boss who has been incredibly supportive. Although I am just now letting the teens/parish know, one year ago I told Father that in July of 2013 I would be leaving SJN to enter into the world of domestic glory. July 2013 is still REALLY far away, but I wanted to let parishioners know because we will be starting the search for our new youth minister sometime in the next couple of months. The goal would be that we are able to have a smooth transition and our strong youth ministry program (one of the strongest in the Archdiocese of Detroit in my humble opinion) will continue to be a defining feature of this parish.
