

# **IT'S MY OPINION AND I HAVE ONE!**

Hello all!

This weekend is the feast of the Holy Family and I thought maybe I would look at a particular member of that family, and it is not Jesus or Mary, but Joseph. Let us put Joseph into context! He was a regular guy and he had a plan to marry a young lady by the name of Mary. All of a sudden he finds out she is pregnant! WOW!!! What would you do? It was well within Joseph's right to walk away but he doesn't. At first he is planning to marry her and divorce her quietly so she does not suffer any shame. Then in a dream the Angel comes to him and he decides to stay with her and raise Jesus as his own. As the scripture says, He, meaning Joseph, is a righteous man! Joseph was truly a JUST, HUMBLE, and OBEDIENT man!

Joseph was one of the most profound people in the history of humanity, a man of great regard and love for God and we know all this without him ever uttering a word! Have you ever thought about the fact that Joseph does not speak a single word all throughout scripture yet we know everything about who he is— why? His actions! As the saying goes Actions speak louder than words! In the case of Joseph this was never truer!

JUST - Scripture tells us clearly that St. Joseph was "a just man" (Mt 1:19). This powerful statement is made in reference to his initial decision to divorce Mary after she became pregnant. While at first this sounds like a contradiction, there are several opinions about Joseph's motivation. St. Justin Martyr, St. John Chrysostom, and St. Augustine felt that St. Joseph suspected Mary of adultery and decided to obtain a divorce (which was permissible under Mosaic law) until the angel explained the situation to him. St. Jerome held the view that Joseph couldn't explain Mary's pregnancy and decided that a "quiet" divorce was the most charitable option. Finally, St. Bernard of Clairvaux and St. Thomas Aquinas subscribe to the theory that Joseph was fully aware of Mary's mission, but felt unworthy to be a part of the plan. Therefore, he decided that a quiet divorce was the best option. While these theories are quite different, the common thread is that St. Joseph wanted to do the right thing.

**HUMBLE** - The fact that so little is known about Joseph helps us to see the importance of humility. The vast majority of us perform our daily work in relative obscurity, but that's how we achieve our sanctification. St. Joseph shows us that we don't have to be famous to do great things.

**OBEDIENT** - Throughout his life, Joseph was obedient to God's Will. When the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and explained the virgin birth, Joseph took Mary as his wife (Mt 1:20-24). When the Lord instructed him to take his family to Egypt, he did so without complaint (Mt 2:13-15). He then obeyed the angel's subsequent commands to return to Israel (Mt 2:19-20) and settle in Nazareth (Mt 2:22-23).

If we can learn to imitate St. Joseph and become just, humble and obedient to God's Will, we will be on the road that will lead us to eternal life in Heaven. While any of these qualities are difficult (if not impossible) to master on our own, with God's help ALL things are possible. Through the intercession of St. Joseph, let's ask the Lord to help us become just, humble and obedient!

Anyone who has attended a Service of Lessons and Carols knows how effective this hymn can be when a boy's solo voice sings verse one and the choir and congregation join in grand crescendo through the rest of this marvelous hymn! The author of the text was Cecil Frances Alexander, wife of an Anglican (Episcopal) Bishop, who wrote many hymns to teach the articles of the Apostles' Creed to children.

Every hymn has 2 components: a tune and a text. This tune is named IRBY. The tune was composed by Henry J. Gauntlett(1805-1876). He was a lawyer to age 40 and then devoted his life to music after that. He was organist at many London churches. Eventually the degree of Mus. Doc. was granted him by the Archbishop of Canterbury.

The verse that I love is verse 4:

For He is our childhood's pattern; Day by day, like us, He grew; He was little, weak, and helpless, Tears and smiles, like us He knew; And He cares when we are sad, And he shares when we are glad.


## \* GIVE YOURSELVES A WEEKEND\*

# **FAITH FORMATION**



Today is the feast of the Holy Family. We celebrate the family of Jesus: that is Jesus, Mary and Joseph. This day is a reminder to celebrate our own family and the holiness we find there.

Maureen Kelly tells the story of Preston, a young boy who went with his family on vacation to Disney World. The family was having a wonderful time riding the rides, swimming, and going on water slides. Everyone was to meet at a certain place at 3:00; but when 3:00 came Preston was not there. After a bit of waiting, Preston's family split up to search for him and agreed to return to the meeting place at 3:30. At 3:30 no one had found Preston; but all of sudden there he was. Preston's dad said, "Preston, where were you? We looked all over for you. We were worried about you." But Preston answered with excitement that he had spent the whole day at Dino Land. "It was awesome!"

Maureen Kelly tells this story to point out that Jesus, like Preston, didn't consider himself lost. Preston was happy and excited about learning about dinosaurs. Jesus was enjoying being in his Father's house and learning more about God so much that he lost track of time, forgetting that his parents might be worried.

We might ask ourselves, do we sometimes lose Jesus too? We may get so busy with friends or work or various activities that we don't think about Jesus or what he wants us to do. We might forget to pray or to set aside some time to think about what a good friend Jesus is to us. So let's make this a day to celebrate our own family and do something fun together, like play a game; but also talk about how our family is holy too because we belong to Jesus.

# FAITH WORKS

The Feast of the Holy Family emphasizes the meaning of the God with us. it also marks a transition in Luke's gospel. Jesus was twelve years old - a time of

transition to adulthood in that culture. Jesus wasn't lost in the Temple; he had to be there, the place which is the heart of wisdom, the place of his father.

As the story is written, the family was on the great yearly pilgrimage to Jerusalem. This time Jesus was not a child. He was Bar Mitzvah - a "Son of the Law." Mary and Joseph think Jesus is "lost." They seek franticly for him, finally finding him in the Temple.

When a child on the brink of adulthood breaks into a world beyond what his parents have known or seemed to have know, it's hard on the parents. Suddenly, there is a gap between parent and child.

Parents come to realize that children are not our possessions but rather our companions on the pilgrimage of life. So they have to discover in themselves the wisdom of God to discern, to believe, to restrain, to let go, and to recognize their limitations.

As the story ends, we are left with the assuring thought that when family life is a mutually respectful affair between parents and children, both grow to full maturity.


