I am not sure how many of you are aware that this Friday is March for Life in Washington DC. Mary has a few young people going to this pilgrimage and I am joining them during this time. I thought it might be nice for all of you to see the history of how the "March for Life" pilgrimage came into its inception, so I did a little researching on line to find something and here it is!

Late in October 1973, grassroots prolife leaders became concerned that January 22, 1974 might come and go without properly memorializing the Supreme Court's infamous abortion decisions and without petitioning Congress for redress.

No established right-to-life organization was prepared to undertake the planning, financial and operational responsibilities for a high impact prolife March on the U.S. Capitol. But, grassroots proliferers wanted to march! About thirty prolife veterans resolved themselves into a committee and began making plans for the first **MARCH FOR LIFE**.

On January 22, 1974, the first **MARCH FOR LIFE** was held on the West Steps of the Capitol. An estimated 20,000 committed prolife Americans rallied that day on behalf of our preborn brothers and sisters.

The numbers have gradually risen through the years despite reduced numbers from the snow in 2000 and the terrible 9/11 attacks just months before the March 2002. These growing numbers give testimony to the increasing ranks of prolife Americans and to the importance of the March's work.

Next Friday, the 25th of January I ask all of you to keep all those attending **MARCH FOR LIFE** in your prayers, along with all of the innocent unborn. The all day adoration we have here at St. John Neumann is going to be for the end to abortion and what the **MARCH FOR LIFE** represents.

Cucchi's Corner

This month we have been singing the Alleluia by Fr. Jim Chepponis of the Diocese of Pittsburgh. The Alleluia is part of *Jubilation Mass*. Fr. Chepponis explains in the front cover of the Mass: *Jubilation Mass was written over a ten-year period. It was begun in 1987 and was expanded, tested, and altered until written down in final form in 1999.*

Fr. Chepponis is a widely published composer. Since 1996, Fr. Jim has served the Diocese of Pittsburgh as Director of the Office for Music Ministry, and his work includes providing music for all Diocesan liturgies, directing the Diocesan Choirs and serving as a music resource person for parishes throughout the city. In July of 2003, Fr. Chepponis was also appointed as pastor of St. John Capistran Parish in the Upper St. Clair, suburb of Pittsburgh. His published articles on music/ liturgy have appeared in liturgy periodicals.

Today's Gospel (John 2: 1-11) relates the story of the wedding feast at Cana and Jesus' first miracle. The story give us some insight into Mary's relationship with Jesus as well as her compassion for others.

Mary sees a concern and in a way makes it her own and then takes it to Jesus. This reminds me of the message of the Faith UNwrapped we just completed this past week. When we come to liturgy we are to bring ourselves, every bit of our selves so to speak.

At our meal lesson everyone was invited to share a part of their own life with those at the table. It could have been something wonderful that had happened or something sad. It could have been an accomplishment or something that didn't go as planned, or perhaps a wish or something for which we are thankful, or perhaps a concern for our community or our world.

We completed the lesson by writing down a brief statement of a personal story and a statement of a community story. Each of these stories are a bit of ourselves and each is to be brought to the table of the Eucharist when we attend Mass We bring ourselves forward with the bread and the wine and the money we offer.

As in the story of the wedding feast at Cana, Jesus takes it all. The bread and the wine are transformed into Jesus. We too are transformed into Jesus as we offer ourselves.

The Vatican II document on the Sacred Liturgy teaches that we, the people of God, must fully participate, giving our whole selves to the celebration of the Mass. Like Mary, we bring it all to Jesus.

Many miracles have been attributed to her intercession, but even knowledge of her prayer is a source of comfort for those who yearn for them. Many people live in the hope of a miracle or the “magic” that will ease pain, take away sorrow, stop something from happening, or cause something to happen. In faithful intercession, we find we really don't want “magic” but are in need of a deeper healing and a more insightful sense of God's love for us. What is it that you are praying for?

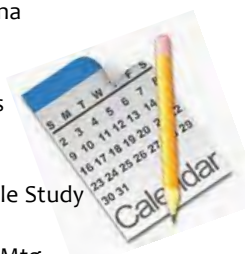

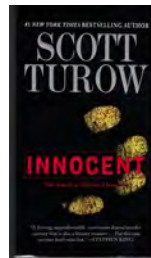
