Cucchi's Corner

We are not sure of the year of his birth. He was born at the family castle in Roccasecca near Aquino, Italy. His family was of noble descent, the counts of Aquino, can be traced back several centuries to the Lombards. Landulf, Thomas's father was a knight and his mother Theodora was of Norman descent. When Thomas was 5 he was sent to the Benedictine abbey of Monte Cassino to be educated. Around 1239 he went to the University of Naples to finish his education. During that time he joined the Order of Preachers (Dominicans).

His great contributions are his many volumes of theological writings-characterized by his sharp distinction between faith & reason. The idea here is that Christian doctrines that cannot be totally understood by reason, are not contrary to reason but can reach us by revelation.

Aquinas's great literary work is *Summa Theologica*-it was so important that at the Council of Trent, it was placed upon the altar beside the Bible. Aquinas, one of the 33 Doctors of the Church, is considered the greatest theologian by many Catholics.



In today's Gospel (Luke 1: 1.4; 4:14-21) we hear the story of Jesus announcing who he is to be to the world. We recently completed the January Faith UNwrapped regarding the **Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy** - probably the most influential document to come out of Vatican 2.

There were several teachings that altered the way we laypeople prayed during the liturgy.

- The Church was described as the whole People of God, not simple the clergy. Prior to Vatican 2 the clergy prayed the Mass while the congregation was directed to private prayer. This approach provided a new role for laypeople in the liturgy of all sacraments. The church celebrated the liturgy, not only the ordained. A reason why the priest/presider moved to the other side of the altar.
- •The restoration of Baptism-linked-to-Confirmation as essential and basic sacrament of ministry restored the liturgical roles of readers, extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist, cantors, ushers, mass helpers (both genders), sacristans, even greeters and media ministers.
- •The recognition that the local community constitutes full expression of the Church (a microcosm of the universal church) encouraged local customs, language, provided for cultural adaptation. Using the language of the people radically changed how the assembly participated.
- •The renewal of the Liturgy being based in Scripture produced the development of our lectionary in which there are 3 years of scriptural readings for Sunday and 2 years for all the weekdays. More scripture than any other Christian community encounters in their prayer.



Adrian Dominican Sisters to Host "Come and See" Weekend


