

Hello Everyone!

For the past couple of weeks, we have been learning about Christian stewardship. While prayer is the first fundamental principle of Christian stewardship, nurturing our family is the second.

Christians are called to exercise good stewardship by nurturing family relationships. With Christ as its center, the family is a sign of Christian love in the world today. The Holy Spirit strengthens family relationships, whether they are between husband and wife, parent and child, or brother and sister.

The hustle and bustle of today's hectic world often limit the amount of time families are able to spend with each other. But it is important that families make time to share in each other's lives. This period of "family time" brings families closer to each other and to God.

Please review and reflect on the enclosed brochure, Nurturing Our Family with Time and Love. I pray that this brochure will bring you to a deeper understanding of the family and its relationship to the true spirit of Christian stewardship.

These past two weekends we heard from Ray VanHoeck and Lorraine Zazsek. I want to thank them for their witness.

As a continuation of our Called by Christ Gifted by the Spirit, I wish to address in further detail, The Stewardship of Time.

Each of us has been given enough time to accomplish God's purpose for us on this planet. The Scriptures ask us to invest our time wisely, reminding us that God determines the length of our stay on earth. "Watch carefully then how you live, not as foolish persons but as wise, making the most of the opportunity, because the days are evil." (Eph 5:15-16).

Toward the end of his life, Moses prayed, "Teach us to count our days aright, that we may gain wisdom of heart" (Ps 90:12). Time is our most valuable asset, but without a proper perspective, we will spend it foolishly. A biblical perspective on time involves several things:

Life is brief, and we cannot be presumptuous about the future (Jas 4:14)

The eternal gives meaning to the temporal (Rom 13:11; 2 Cor 4:18)

Like other assets, our time is owned by God (Ps 31:15)

We must be sensitive to opportunities so that we can make the most of them (Ecc 8:5; Col 4:5)

Our use of time will reflect our priorities (Mt 6:19-21, 34)

Just as it is wise to budget our financial resources, it is also wise to budget our use of time. Most time is wasted not in hours, but in minutes. If we do not regularly assess the way we spend our 168 hours per week, our schedules will get cluttered with activities that may be good, but not the best.

How much quality time do we spend with the Lord, with our spouse, with our children, and with our non-Christian friends? God wants us to be faithful stewards, not squanderers, of the time He has given us.

Exercise: Carefully evaluate your weekly use of time by filling in a 168 hour worksheet as accurately as possible. What areas need to be trimmed down, and where should you be spending more of your time?

I Corinthians 15:14

The text of this hymn was penned by Charles Wesley (1707-1788). The tune LLANFAIR was composed by Robert Williams (1781-1821). Charles Wesley was a leader of the Methodist Church, son of Anglican clergyman and poet Samuel Wesley.

As I read through the text the one line that struck me was: Where, O death, is now your sting? This line references I Corinthians 15:55. As believers we should have no fear of death and dying if we trust in Christ's victory over death.

Faith UNwrapped: ADULTS ONLY

After 50 years of the Second Vatican Council, where do we go next?

ADULTS ONLY! This Tuesday we conclude a six month study of the teachings of the Second Vatican Council for adults. All of the 1.2 billion Catholics today have been affected by this ecumenical council.

One of the most warmly received insights of Vatican 2 is that salvation is concerned not solely with saving souls but also with saving the whole person—body and soul. This holistic view is appealing because we naturally do not want to lose any genuine part of our human experience. St. Irenaeus, often quoted at the time of the Second Vatican Council, captured this well: "The glory of God is the human person fully alive!"

Jesus' mission on this earth was not only to free the human heart from sin, but also to free men and women from disease, oppression and everything that hinders their development as humans created by God and destined for eternal life. When we profess our belief in the resurrection of the body, this integral salvation is implied.

In *The Church in the Modern World*, the bishops of Vatican II acknowledged the intimate bond between the Church and all humanity. This great document begins: "The joys and hopes, the grief and anguish of the people of our time, especially those who are poor or afflicted, are the joys and hopes, the grief and anguish of the followers of Christ. Nothing that is genuinely human fails to find an echo in their hearts."

Every authentic dimension of human existence is to be saved and brought to wholeness. We are to help all people come to their full humanity as men and women created in the image and likeness of God and redeemed by Christ.


Consider joining us this Tuesday to discuss what is next for us Catholics.

EASTER RELEVANCE What is the cost of love? When we frame love in this question, the subject transcends the feeling. No longer does love remain in the realm of the heart. It becomes a decision of the will. The question implies that we do not truly love unless we are willing to act upon our feelings and live with the consequences. Love may not be love without an inner emotion, but it cannot survive without action. And it cannot grow without testing.

To claim love is easy, to live love is difficult. Yet, in Jesus, we find the example of love perfectly lived out. We also find the power to live love to the fullest.

Jesus "chose" his "friends." They did not choose him. Jesus chose his followers for a mission: to "lay down" their lives as he did, so their self-giving might produce lasting "fruit." Hence, the kernel of Christian spirituality, self-giving ("laying down" life), roots the Christian community: relationship based upon service. Both of these notions were based upon love. When Christians truly loved others, even to the point of death, they became "friends" of Jesus and the Father.

When have you felt the love of God? When have you passed that love onto others? How did your efforts effect those you loved?


SJN T-BALL REGISTRATION
