

He was bearing our faults in his own body on the cross, so that we might die to our faults and live for holiness; through his wounds you have been healed. 1 Peter 2:24

A hymn that we sing on Holy Thursday every year is called *There is a Balm in Gilead*. Many years ago I wondered... what is a Balm? Balm is defined as an oil used for healing, anointing or soothing. Then I wondered ... Gilead... where is it and what is its significance in regard to healing? Gilead is a mountainous region east of the Jordan River in Jordan. "Balm in Gilead" is mentioned in the Old Testament. In Jeremiah chapter 8 vs. 22 "Is there no balm in Gilead anymore? Is there no doctor there?" Jeremiah 46:11 says: "Go up to Gilead in search of balm." Gilead is also mentioned in Jeremiah 22:6.

I guess what this hymn means to me today is that Jesus is the great Physician. Whether it is a physical ailment, discouragement or some disappointment life throws at us; anything really- we can take it to Jesus and find solace and hope.

Just an aside... I had forgotten that Balm in Gilead is mentioned in *The Raven*:

to voice disappointment that a loved one was omitted from the Prayers of the Faithful, formerly known as the General

Intercessions and now known as the **Universal Prayer**. The loved one had been chronically ill and has been placed on the list several times. The parish policy is to remove sick people from the list after 3 weeks and place their names in the bulletin - as long as necessary.

The purpose of the parish policy is to keep the list we read aloud at the Sunday liturgy relatively short and to introduce new people to the community who have just become ill. The bulletin list, on the other hand, reminds us of those dealing with long-term illness.

Back to the disappointment. One source of consolation is that at EVERY Eucharist, we pray for every person who has ever lived and every person living on earth. We pray that the Holy Spirit of God touch all humanity with unity and wellness. Listen closely to the last part of any Eucharistic Prayer (after the Institution Narrative, consecration). There is a special kind of prayer called an "epiclesis" - calling the Holy Spirit to be present among us with healing power so that we might be united to Jesus and to each other. No one is forgotten in this prayer. Remember that this happens in every liturgy throughout the world. The Eucharist is being celebrated 24/7. The Church prays for everyone continuously.

Thinking about the Eucharistic Prayer is a good

One parishioner contacted us last week reminder that this prayer is not only the priest's prayer. The priest prays the Eucharistic Prayer aloud in our name. Notice the pronoun "we" consistently used through out the prayer. It is important to listen and silently participate in the prayer, responding with acclamations when appropriate. As you listen, you will notice the theme of gratitude for Jesus and the desire to develop the same attitude of Jesus of self-giving. It is an invitation to transformation and healing.

# SHOWING OUR STEWARDSHIP THROUGH WORSHIP

The Education Commission's mission in St. John Neumann parish is to provide opportunities for each member of the community to learn and grow in their faith in Jesus and, by living out that faith, share it with others. The committees working within the Education Commission offer many opportunities for people to learn through sharing their time and talents.

The Faith Formation/Catechetics Committee is responsible for our large weekly program and Faith UNwrapped, designed for families of all ages. The Middle School and Youth Group Committees, sacramental preparation and VBS are all part of a traditional view of religious education. More than 100 volunteers are needed for the programs to function as planned, as teachers as well as other talented people. The Adult Faith Formation Committee takes care of all the details necessary to arrange faith development programs aimed at adults in the parish. This year we organized five different programs and more are coming. The Vocations Committee this year has implemented our wonderful Traveling Chalice program to pray for vocations. We are all eager to hear new ideas and to work along with you to develop all of us into the servants we are called to be.

## WHAT ARE MY ENVELOPES USED FOR:

Every other month you receive a packet of envelopes. Each envelope is used for different purposes.

The white envelope, Weekly Sunday Offering;

These are used to pay expenses of the parish including payroll, utilities, and programs of the parish, supplies like hosts and wine and all other operating expenses of the parish.

Your gold, Mission Envelope;

These are sent to the Archdiocese each month as a donation to the missions of the Archdiocese.

You grey and white, Debt Reduction;

These are used to help pay off the current \$166,000 debt of the parish.

Your blue, Facility Maintenance;

These are used for the maintenance expenses of operating this large facility, St. John Neumann Church and the grounds.

Children's Envelopes;

Like the Sunday Offerings envelopes, these are used to pay off Parish expenses.

There are always purple and white envelopes on the credenzas. These are in case you forget yours.

To make contributing easier for you, we do offer two ways you can donate by way of electronic contributions. You can go onto our website at <a href="https://www.stjohnneumann.us">www.stjohnneumann.us</a> and click onto the Online Giving icon to set up and process your contributions similar to paying your bills online, or you can have us process your contributions by filling out the blue ACH forms found on the credenzas in the gathering area.

If you contribute electronically, we do not send you envelopes. This saves the parish the expense of envelopes and postage. You will receive a contribution statement for tax purposes at the end of the year regardless of how you contribute as long as we have a record of your contribution.
