Summer Prayer Corner

By Julie Filby

Create a summertime prayer corner in your home, in your yard, or on your deck, patio, or balcony. It can serve as a sacred space for prayer and teach reverence for the holy.

For: Young Family

Season: Summer

Needed: Small table or sturdy box; covering such as a tablecloth, table runner, or colorful napkins or scarves; battery-powered candle; items with religious meaning (crucifix, cross, sculpture, icons, picture of Jesus); Bible and/or prayer book; optional: flowers

Prepare in Advance: Consider possible locations for your summer prayer corner. Gather supplies from the list above.

Activity Plan

1. Gather as a family and talk about how a summer prayer corner can remind family members of God's love and care. It also is a reminder that home is a sacred place where God dwells, even on those days when it doesn't feel like it! Pray aloud:

Gracious God, may the words of our mouths and the love in our hearts be pleasing to you. in Jesus' name. Amen.

2. Work together to choose a place to set up the prayer corner. It likely will be inside your home, but if you have a protected space outside on a

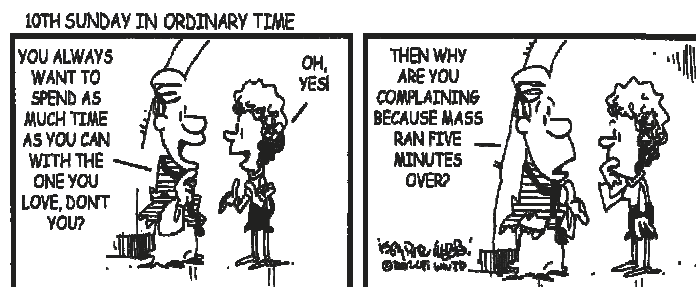
patio or in the yard, that could be a lovely sacred space for prayer.

3. Work together to set up the table or box and cover it with a tablecloth, scarves or other fabric. On it, place a battery-powered candle, Bible, prayer book, and other items that have special religious meaning for your family. Perhaps include photos of loved ones to remember in prayer. If you have a garden, include a small vase to hold a fresh flower or two. Invite family members to add or exchange items in the prayer corner as the summer progresses.

4. Light the candle and invite family members to offer sentence prayers for your family and your summer plans.

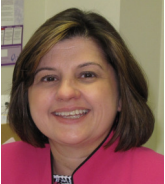
5. Plan to leave the prayer corner in place all summer as a place where family members can gather for prayer and conversation. Encourage family members to use this corner as individuals when they are looking for a quiet, sacred place to have a conversation with God.

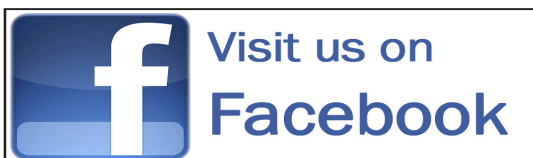

WHAT ARE MY ENVELOPES USED FOR:

Every other month you receive a packet of envelopes. Each envelope is used for different purposes. The white envelope, Weekly Sunday Offering; These are used to pay expenses of the parish including payroll, utilities, and programs of the parish, supplies like hosts and wine and all other operating expenses of the parish.

Your gold, Mission Envelope; These are sent to the Archdiocese each month as a donation to the missions of the Archdiocese.

You grey and white, Debt Reduction; These are used to help pay off the current \$166,000 debt of the parish.

Your blue, Facility Maintenance; These are used for the maintenance expenses of operating this large facility, St. John Neumann Church and the grounds.

Children's Envelopes; Like the Sunday Offerings envelopes, these are used to pay off Parish expenses.

There are always purple and white envelopes on the credenzas. These are in case you forget yours.

To make contributing easier for you, we do offer two ways you can donate by way of electronic contributions. You can go onto our website at www.stjohnneumann.us and click onto the Online Giving icon to set up and process your contributions similar to paying your bills online, or you can have us process your contributions by filling out the blue ACH forms found on the credenzas in the gathering area.

If you contribute electronically, we do not send you envelopes. This saves the parish the expense of envelopes and postage. You will receive a contribution statement for tax purposes at the end of the year regardless of how you contribute as long as we have a record of your contribution.

Society of St. Vincent de Paul

A lot has been happening lately.....

While members of the St. Vincent de Paul Society at SJN continue our primary mission of paying rent and utility bills and providing food, clothing and medical care to the needy, we have been actively participating in a number of other activities to better assist the families we serve.

This year, the national organization of the Society has encouraged the local conferences to think creatively about the poverty we see. We have been encouraged to look beyond satisfying an immediate need, and look instead as to what we might do to prevent the financial crisis from recurring. The term being used for this philosophy of assistance is *Systemic Change*.

We have learned through our visits to the poor that many individuals wish to work and are capable of working, but do not have adequate transportation. Members of the SJN conference have been active participants in a collaborative effort with the Plymouth Community United Way, the Salvation Army and other local non-profits to address this issue. We have developed a plan to provide auto-repair at a reduced fee for families who have cars that are operable, but are in need of repair. We are currently working on a similar program to provide transportation to and from job interviews and to assist individuals who procure jobs with transportation until they receive their first paychecks. Local cab companies are stepping up to help us make this program a reality. Working to solve the transportation needs of the families we serve is an important first step to *Systemic Change*.

SVDP would like to send a special thank you to Nancy McGee who has been volunteering her time and talent to helping some of the people we serve develop their resumes. This service is invaluable to our goal of helping people become self-sufficient.

Last month, a very generous parishioner (who wishes to remain anonymous) donated a car to a family we serve. A young mother of 3 children who had lost her car in a fire was in desperate need of transportation. This was a triple blessing - the gentleman who donated the car was delighted that his gift was so well received; the woman who received the car had her prayer answered; and the Vincentians who facilitated the transfer knew the joy of serving. Thank you again to this very wonderful parishioner.

This year, SVDP at SJN is sponsoring 5 campers to Camp Ozanam. This residential camp program sponsored by SVDP is celebrating its 90th year of offering a camp experience to under-privileged children. Think of the thrill of roasting marshmallows around a campfire, fishing and swimming in one of Michigan's glorious lakes, sharing a cabin with friends, and learning about God by enjoying his natural creation. The Vincentian who has volunteered to head up this program was a camper himself, and he knows the impact a camp experience can have on a young child. Many, many thanks to him.

Many of the clients served by SVDP receive some assistance through the Department of Human Services. DHS has announced a policy to be "paper free" in the near future. That means all applications and requests for assistance will be done "on line." As you might well imagine, many of the families served by SVDP do not own computers, and those who own them need assistance navigating the now 30-page application. Under the leadership of one of SJN's Vincentians, our conference will be hosting the training sessions for this new process, and we will also be one of the sites where individuals can go for assistance with the new DHS application.

On a sadder note, I am sure most of you know that there was a fire in the shopping mall on Wayne Road, just south of Warren Road. Tragically, a young fire fighter lost his life trying to put out the blaze. The SVDP Westland Thrift Store was located at this site. Although the loss of life in no way compares to the loss of material goods, it is still sad that almost all of the donated items used to serve the poor at this store were destroyed due to smoke damage. More than ever, your donations to SVDP are needed. Please consider donating gently used clothing, household items, and furniture to SVDP. Call 877-St Vince (788-4623) to have your items picked up. Thank you.

We have said it before, but never often enough – The SJN conference is particularly blessed to have such wonderful support from our parishioners. Thank you so much for all you do to share in our mission. May you all know God's blessings in your lives.

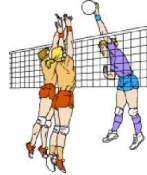
