Though we are at the beginning of summer it seems as though it is flying by, doesn't it? During these weeks we see our parishioners popping in and out as they go on various vacations throughout this time, so I suggest we keep all of our SJN parish family in prayer for a safe summer and travels.

Today I wanted to talk to you about what is going on with the CLT program and the contributions you made to it. As you know we completed Changing Lives Together back in March of 2012. Since that time your contributions have been coming in. As you also know the major project we are planning to do with the funds is a renovation of the worship space and office space. I wanted to give you an update as to what is happening with that.

We have gone to the Archdiocese for approval of bringing in an architect and that has been granted. A design committee has been formed and has been coming up with ideas of what to do while keeping in mind the character of St John Neumann. However, at the same time having an updated space that will give a good sense of worship should always be the first priority in the renovation.

Our hope is to meet with an architect either late in the summer or early in the fall so drawings can be put together. By having drawings we can give all of you a visual of the plans we are looking to do in the renovation/face lift of the worship space, gathering area and offices.

Again I want to reassure you that the design committee has been keeping in mind that we do not want to lose the character of St John Neumann while at the same time doing those things that are necessary in the renovation of a worship space. Know that as soon as we are able to show you a visual of what is being planned we will. The design team and myself feel it is of utmost importance that you are aware of what is going on in order to make sure you are all well informed at all times.

One thing we have talked about is trying to find a way to bring in some natural lighting into the building and we believe we have found a way to make this possible and beautiful. I know many of you have expressed to me that you wish we had natural lighting inside the body of the church as well.

I am looking forward to sharing more information with you as we are able to get things together.

Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship, a revision of Music in Catholic Worship, was developed by the Committee on Divine Worship of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). On November 14, 2007, the Latin Church members of the USCCB approved these guidelines. These guidelines are designed to provide direction to those preparing for the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy according to the current liturgical books (in the ordinary form of celebration).

Foreword

Greetings from the bishops of the United States to priests, deacons, liturgists, music directors, composers, cantors, choirs, congregations, and faith communities throughout the United States. "Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." It is our duty and our joy as shepherds of the Church to guide and oversee liturgical song in each particular Church. Liturgy is the source of the Church's prayer and action, and the summit by which our lives and all our ministries ascend to the Father. We pray that this document will draw all who worship the Lord into the fullness of liturgical, musical prayer.

I. WHY WE SING

- 1. God has bestowed upon his people the gift of song. God dwells within each human person, in the place where music takes its source. Indeed, God, the giver of song, is present whenever his people sing his praises.2
- 2. A cry from deep within our being, music is a way for God to lead us to the realm of higher things.3 As St. Augustine says, "Singing is for the one who loves." 4 Music is therefore a sign of God's love for us and of our love for him. In this sense, it is very personal. But unless music sounds, it is not music, and whenever it sounds, it is accessible to others. By its very nature song has both an individual and a communal dimension. Thus, it is no wonder that singing together in church expresses so well the sacramental presence of God to his people.




