MICHIGAN CATHOLIC CONFERENCE

21 states have passed laws restricting abortion coverage in plans offered through the health care exchange. In doing so, these states sent a strong message in support of life and dignity, and now it is Michigan's turn. Help Michigan become the 22nd state to pass abortion insurance opt-out legislation by visiting MichigansVoice.com.

An exciting opportunity is before Michigan citizens. By working together we can keep our tax dollars and insurance premiums from paying for abortions as a part of Michigan health care.

The federal health care reform law (Affordable Care Act), enacted in March 2010, requires that insurance exchanges be available in all 50 states by 2014. The ACA contains a special provision allowing the states to exclude abortion as a covered benefit. The petition drive needs to happen in 2013 so that Michigan can be ready for the federally required health exchanges which begin in 2014.

Michigan's Constitution allows the people to initiate legislation through a petition. The petition seeks to pass the Abortion Insurance Opt-Out legislation. The advantage of this approach is that the bill's language cannot be changed by the Michigan Legislature, nor can it be vetoed by the governor.

In order to propose this bill to the legislature, 258,000 valid signatures of registered voters must be gathered within 180 days. Once petitions are approved by the Board of Canvassers and submitted to the legislature, the legislature has 40 calendar days to act.

If a simple majority in both the House and Senate approves the bill, it becomes law without the governor's signature. The law would become effective 90 days after the end of the legislative session.

Please take a few moments to sign the petition. Abortion is not health care.

FAITH WORKS



What's the difference between what we pray for and what we should pray for? Why is there such a difference? Ask God!

Why don't we pray for the truly great things? In all honesty, most of us Christians focus our prayer life on the mundane needs that arise day to day.

That is to be expected. Sometimes, however, we pray for greater things. World peace. The conversion of sinners. The safety of those who are struck with disaster.

Prayer for small and greater things is good, for it is faith in action. Prayer is active trust in God. But, we forget the power of prayer affects us directly. As we pray, we are changed. And the measure of our change can sometimes depend upon scope of what we pray for.

How many of us are willing to risk everything in prayer? How many of us are willing to beg God for his Kingdom? Well, ask God!

In the gospel, the disciples asked Jesus how to pray. In reality, they asked Jesus how to approach God, how to see God. Jesus answered with a standard Jewish prayer form (Address, Petitions for God, Petitions for the Person, Final Praise or Doxology). But, in his prayer, he summarized his message. The Our Father was a prayer for God's Kingdom. They received a lesson on how a Christian should live. As they prayed, so should they live.

How should a disciple ask the Father for his kingdom? Constantly! And with complete confidence! The disciple should always ask for the kingdom, and the disciple should trust that God will answer the prayer.

But, for Jesus, constant prayer and complete trust in God were more than a prayer style; they defined Christian living. When Jesus answered the request, "Teach us to pray," Jesus taught his followers how to live as Christians. Ask, seek, knock for the kingdom. If God is good to all his sinful creatures, how much more will he bless his children. He will give them his power and his presence; he will give his children the Holy Spirit! What more could need?

Have you ever received the Holy Spirit when you've prayed?

Prayer Request from St. Vincent de Paul

Since the almost-two-years that the St. Vincent de Paul has been serving the St. John Neumann Community, we have provided

temporary shelter to 20 homeless individuals and families. Other SVDP Conferences in the surrounding areas have experienced a similar increase in the number of newly homeless. To investigate how we might better serve this population, not only to provide temporary shelter, but to assist them to obtain adequate housing and financial resources, an Exploratory Commit-

tee to End Homeless in Western Wayne County has been formed. To date, we have developed a preliminary proposal, a budget, and a fund-raising plan. We are now seeking interested parties to serve on the board. People with fund-raising experience, attorneys, real-estate development expertise, bankers, clergy and others are welcome to inquire about how they might assist us in this effort.

Most importantly, however, we are in need of prayer. Please pray that our effort will be successful. The following prayer is said by the committee members at the beginning of each meeting. Please add your prayers to ours. As always, we are most grateful for your support.

Hear our prayer today for all women and men, boys and girls who are homeless this day:

For those sleeping under bridges, on park benches, in doorways or bus stations;

For those who can only find shelter for the night but must wonder in the daytime;

For families broken because they could not afford to pay rent.

For those who have no relatives or friends who can take them in.

For those who have no place to keep possessions that remind them who they are.

For those who are afraid and hopeless.

For those who have been betrayed by our social safety net.

For all these people we pray thast your will provide shelter, security and hope.

We pray for those of us with warm houses and comfortable beds

That we not be lulled into complacency and forgetfulness.

Jesus, help us to see your face in the eyes of every homeless person we meet

So, that we may be empowered through word and deed, And through the political means we have
