Theandric- Sacred Music in a Spirit of Reparation

the`an`dric (thè`àn`drik)

a. 1. *Relating to, or existing by, the union of divine and human operation in Christ, or the joint agency of the divine and human nature* **Theandric** is essentially the vision of one man, Paul Tiseo, a singer/songwriter, guitarist, bassist, and aspiring organist whose music is inspired by the pursuit of Beauty and Truth. In the words of the Holy Father Pope Benedict XVI, "Music is, in fact, capable of opening minds and hearts to the dimension of the spirit and of leading persons to raise their gaze on High, to open to absolute Goodness and Beauty, which have their ultimate source in God. The joy of song and music is also a constant invitation to believers and to all men of good will to commit themselves to give humanity a rich future of hope." Tiseo strives to communicate these spiritual fruits of love, joy, peace and beauty through the gift of music. He includes among his influences a wide range of musical styles, including Renaissance polyphony, Neapolitan folk music, heavy metal, and contemporary composers of sacred music such as Tavener and Part. Some of his favorite artists include Genesis, King's X, Iron Maiden, Fr. Stan Fortuna, Massimo Ranieri, Phil Keaggy, and many more. Tiseo grew up in the suburbs north of Detroit where he continues to reside. After completing his undergrad studies in psychology, he spent one year discerning a vocation to the priesthood at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit. After discerning that his call was to married life, he eventually earned a Master's degree in clinical psychology and works with troubled juveniles in the local community. He is a husband and father of two beautiful children, and considers fatherhood the most rewarding and fulfilling gift of all. In his free time, he dedicates himself to composing and recording music which expresses different aspects of the Divine nature.

THEANDRIC's goals for the future include the completion of a full-length album in 2012, international performances, and building a strong connection with fans of Spirit-filled music worldwide. The name **THEANDRIC** was chosen for the project as it can refer to the harmony of Christ's human and divine nature, but also to refer to our humble human efforts to cooperate with God in the creative process.

Instead of resisting change, we may find ourselves willing to "keep" it.

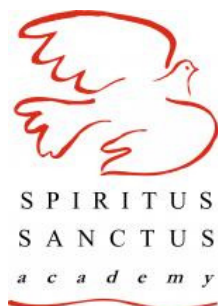

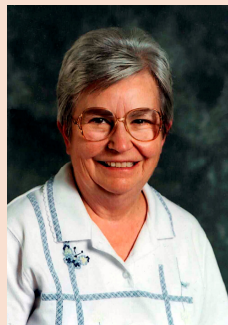

FAITH WORKS

Gene Kijek

Fr. Ron Rolheiser offers us an integrated view of discipleship.

When I look at life, I see three great struggles. And each of these has a corresponding level of Christian discipleship. What are those great struggles and those levels of discipleship? There are three major phases in our human and spiritual journey:

- Essential discipleship* - The struggle to get our lives together
- Generative discipleship* - The struggle to give our lives away
- Radical discipleship* - The struggle to give our deaths away

Essential discipleship and the struggle to get our lives together is our initial task in life. Beginning with our first breath, we struggle to find an identity and to find fulfillment and peace there. We are born in a hospital and soon taken home to where we have parents, a family, and a place that's ours. This period of our lives, childhood, is intended by God and nature to be a secure time. As a child, our major struggles have not yet begun. But that will change dramatically at puberty.

Simply put, puberty is designed by God and nature to drive us out of our homes in search of a home that we ourselves build. And it generally does its job well! It hits us with a tumult and violence that overthrows our childhood and sends us out, restless, sexually-driven, full of grandiose dreams, but confused and insecure, in search of a new home, one that we build for ourselves. This struggle, from being restlessly driven out of our first home to finding a place to call home again, is the journey of Essential discipleship.

Generative discipleship and the struggle to give our lives away is a stage most people reach sometime during their twenties or thirties, though some take longer to cross that threshold. Moreover, the crossover is never pure and complete, the struggle for self-identity and private fulfillment never completely goes away; but, at a certain point, we begin to live more for others than for ourselves. Generative discipleship begins then and, for most of us, this will constitute the longest period of our lives. During all those years, our task in life is clear: How do I give my life away more purely, more generously, more generatively?

But being the responsible adults who run the homes, schools, churches, and businesses of the world is not the final stage our lives. We still must die; the most daunting task of all. And so our default line must shift yet one more time: There comes a point in our lives, when our real question is no longer: 'What can I still do so that my life makes a contribution?' Rather the question becomes: 'How can I now live so that my death will be an optimal blessing for my family, my church, and the world?'

Radical discipleship and the struggle to give our deaths away is the final stage of life: As Christians, we believe that Jesus lived for us and that he died for us, that he gave us both his life and his death. But we often fail to distinguish that

there are two clear and separate movements here: Jesus gave his life for us in one movement, and he gave his death for us in another. He gave his life for us through his activity, through his generative actions for us; and he gave his death through his passivity, through absorbing in love the helplessness, diminutions, humiliations, and loneliness of dying.

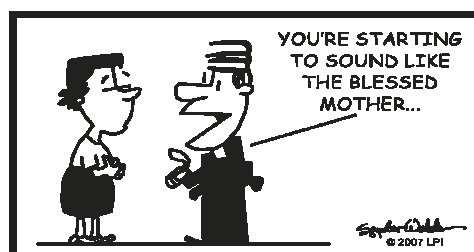
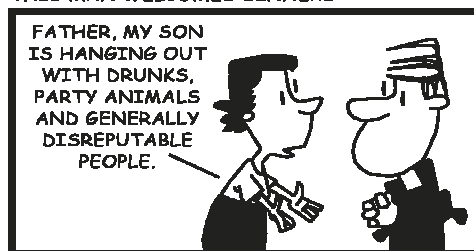
Like Jesus, we too are meant to give our lives away in generosity and selflessness, but we are also meant to leave this planet in such a way that our diminishment and death is our final, and perhaps greatest, gift to the world. Needless to say that's not easy. Walking in discipleship behind the master will require that we too will eventually sweat blood and feel "a stone's throw" from everybody. This struggle, to give our deaths away, as we once gave our lives away, constitutes Radical discipleship.

This week we begin our Religious Education classes. I would like to take this time to thank all our wonderful Catechists and Assistant Catechists for stepping forward to teach our children their faith. Our mission as Catechists is to assist parents to educate their children/teens to live and love as Jesus taught us. The following is our year of instruction at a glance.

Preschool/K = Sign of the Cross, I can talk to Jesus, I am a child of God, Grace at meals, Angel of God prayer.

Grade 1 = Learning about the Mass, Our Father/Hail Mary Prayers, Following Jesus.

Grade 2 = Sacramental Formation for Reconciliation and First Eucharist, Act of Contrition.

Grade 3 = Knowing the Parts of the Mass, Apostle's Creed, Glory Be prayers.

Grade 4 = Deeper understanding of the 10 Commandments, Beatitudes, Jesus Love and Mercy.

Grade 5 = Seven Sacraments, Corporal and Spiritual works of Mercy, Church teachings on Social Justice.

Grade 6 = Familiarity with Bible and how to use it, Knowledge of Old Testament, Rosary and how to pray it.

Grade 8 = Focus on Holy Spirit: Gifts and Fruits, Learning and Understanding Creed, Knowledge of Church teachings and traditions, Involvements in ministry/service, Confirmation Formation, What is my mission?

Let us keep our Catechists in our prayers this week... Jesus; you were the great Catechist who showed us what is really important. May our SJN Catechists always feel your loving embrace all around them. Give them strength, health, patience, love, comfort, and understanding as they connect our children to you. Amen.
