

Hello all!

I was asked to write something on Eucharistic Adoration and talk about the Eucharistic Adoration at SJN! First, here is an explanation for you on Eucharistic Adoration:

As Catholics, we believe that, at the Mass, the bread and wine offered by the priest become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, which we receive in Holy Communion. After Mass has ended, however, the Body and Blood remain, and the Sacred Host is reserved in the tabernacle of every Catholic Church (while the Precious Blood is consumed rather than reserved).

On June 10, 2007, Pope Benedict XVI recommended the practice of Eucharistic adoration to pastors and faithful. The Holy Father pointed out that spending time in prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament is necessary for spiritual growth: "In modern life, so often noisy and dispersive, it is more than ever important to recover the capacity for inner silence and prayer. Eucharistic adoration enables this to happen . . . "

Why is it so important? Four years later, Pope Benedict explained that "the Eucharist is like a beating heart giving life to the mystical Body of the Church, which is a social organization entirely founded on its spiritual yet tangible bond with Christ... Without the Eucharist the Church would simply cease to exist." The enemies of the Church understand this better, perhaps, than many Catholics. That is why atheists such as P.Z. Myers and Richard Dawkins, despite claiming to believe that the Eucharist is a mere "cracker," focus their fury on the Host. In their own twisted way, they acknowledge the power of the Eucharist to transform the lives of believers. Would that all Catholics were as certain of that power!

One way to become convinced of the transformative power of Christ's Body and Blood is to follow Pope Benedict's advice and try to spend some time in Eucharistic adoration. Fortunately we give all of you that opportunity every Friday to spend time in front of the Blessed Sacrament from 9:30am to 6:30pm.

If you look at the bulletin board on the wall as you leave Church each week, we have a board to sign up for a time slot when you can be in the presence of the Body of Christ. Just because a name is signed up for a time slot, this does not mean you cannot sign up along with it. The more people we have praying in front of the presence of Christ the better.

But what I do ask is that as many of you as possible, please SIGN YOUR NAME ON THE BOARD! By signing your name on the board you are making a commitment to be here at that time. Some of you may say 'well if I put my name there than I have said I will be there and I do not have the option not to be.' I guess I ask, why is that a problem? Why is it difficult to COMMIT to spending time with Christ? We as a people commit to everything else going on in our lives, yet to commit to the one who is most important seems to be an impossibility. It should not. So I pray and ask you COMMIT some time every Friday to be with our Lord in Eucharistic Adoration. Put your name on the sign up board so that no one is concerned that Jesus is left ALONE in the chapel!

Theandric is essentially the vision of one man, Paul Tiseo, a singer/songwriter, guitarist, bassist, and aspiring organist whose music is inspired by the pursuit of Beauty and Truth. In the words of the Holy Father Pope Benedict XVI, "Music is, in fact, capable of opening minds and hearts to the dimension of the spirit and of leading persons to raise their gaze on High, to open to absolute Goodness and Beauty, which have their ultimate source in God. The joy of song and music is also a constant invitation to believers and to all men of good will to commit themselves to give humanity a rich future of hope." Tiseo strives to communicate these spiritual fruits of love, joy, peace and beauty through the gift of music. He includes among his influences a wide range of musical styles, including Renaissance polyphony, Neapolitan folk music, heavy metal, and contemporary composers of sacred music such as Tavener and Part. Some of his favorite artists include Genesis, King's X, Iron Maiden, Fr. Stan Fortuna, Massimo Ranieri, Phil Keaggy, and many more.

Tiseo grew up in the suburbs north of Detroit where he continues to reside. After completing his undergrad studies in psychology, he spent one year discerning a vocation to the priesthood at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit. After discerning that

FAITH WORKS

Father John Powell, a professor at Loyola University in Chicago, writes about a student in his Theology of Faith class named Tommy:

Some twelve years ago, I stood watching my university students file into the classroom for our first session in the Theology of Faith. That was the day I first saw Tommy. He was combing his long flaxen hair, which hung six inches below his shoulders. It was the first time I had ever seen a boy with hair that long. I guess it was just coming into fashion then. I know in my mind that it isn't what's on your head but what's in it that counts; but on that day. I was unprepared and my emotions flipped. I immediately filed Tommy under "S" for strange... Very strange.

Tommy turned out to be the "atheist in residence" in my Theology of Faith course. He constantly objected to, smirked at, or whined about the possibility of an unconditionally loving Father/God. We lived with each other in relative peace for one semester, although I admit he was for me at times a serious pain in the back pew.

When he came up at the end of the course to turn in his final exam, he asked in a cynical tone, "Do you think I'll ever find God?" I decided instantly on a little shock therapy. "No!" I said very emphatically. "Why not," he responded, "I thought that was the product you were pushing."

I let him get five steps from the classroom door and then I called out, "Tommy! I don't think you'll ever find Him, but I am absolutely certain that He will find you! "He shrugged a little and left my class and my life. I felt slightly disappointed at the thought that he had missed my clever line -- He will find you! At least I thought it was clever.

Later I heard that Tommy had graduated, and I was duly grateful. Then a sad report came. I heard that Tommy had terminal cancer. Before I could search him out, he came to see me. When he walked into my office, his body was very badly wasted and the long hair had all fallen out as a result of chemotherapy. But his eyes were bright and his voice was firm, for the first time, I believe.

"Tommy, I've thought about you so often; I hear you are sick," I blurted out.

"Oh, yes, very sick. I have cancer in both lungs. It's a matter of weeks."

"Can you talk about it, Tom?" I asked.

"Sure, what would you like to know?" he replied.

"What's it like to be only twenty-four and dying?

"Well, it could be worse.

"Like what?

"Well, like being fifty and having no values or ideals, like being fifty and thinking that booze, seducing women, and making money are the real biggies in life.

I began to look through my mental file cabinet under "S" where I had filed Tommy as strange. (It seems as though everybody I try to reject by classification, God sends back into my life to educate me.)

"But what I really came to see you about," Tom said, "is something you said to me on the last day of class." (He remembered!) He continued, "I asked you if you thought I would ever find God and you said, 'No!' which surprised me. Then you said, 'But He will find you. I thought about that a lot, even though my search for God was hardly intense at that time. (My clever line. He thought about that a lot!)

"But when the doctors removed a lump from my groin and told me that it was malignant, that's when I got serious about locating God. And when the malignancy spread into my vital organs, I really began banging bloody fists against the bronze doors of heaven. But God did not come out. In fact, nothing happened. Did you ever try anything for a long time with great effort and with no success? You get psychologically glutted, fed up with trying. And then you quit.

"Well, one day I woke up, and instead of throwing a few more futile appeals over that high brick wall to a God who may be or may not be there, I just quit. I decided that I didn't really care about God, about an after life, or anything like that. I decided to spend what time I had left doing something more profitable. thought about you and your class and I remembered something else you had said: 'The essential sadness is to go through life without loving. But it would be almost equally sad to go through life and leave this world without ever telling those you loved that you had loved them.

"So, I began with the hardest one, my Dad. He was reading the newspaper when I approached him.



YOUTH MINISTRY WITH CHRIS LEACH

Dear Parents,

Just this week an elder in the Saint John Neumann community came up to me and said that she still remembers how close to God she felt at a youth ministry retreat she went to in high school! Youth ministry retreats are a powerful experience and I want to take a moment to tell you about them because St. John Neumann's is fast approaching! This fall will be the 15th retreat that I have facilitated as a youth minister and I have seen teens meet Jesus in a life-changing way on each!

The theme of this year's retreat is "Christian Ninja Warriors" and we will break open James 1:2-4: "Consider it all joy, my brothers, when you encounter various trials, for you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. And let perseverance be perfect, so that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing." The sessions of the retreat will focus on different challenges to living the Christian life as a teenager and the numerous spiritual tools we have to aid us in this journey (ie. The Sacraments, Grace, Prayer, the Community). The retreat will include small groups, Mass, Reconciliation, Eucharistic Adoration, adult and participant led reflection sessions, a challenge course, and a zip line!

There are many reasons why your child may not be able to go on this retreat... schedules are packed, budgets are tight, homework is always due, but I ask that you prayerfully consider the sacrifices your family may be able to make to ensure your child's participation in this event. I recommend this especially to families whose child cannot make the weekly youth group meetings part of their schedule—consider making this one weekend a priority instead. I am also willing to work with families in any way that I can to make the retreat as accessible as possible!

Finally, I hate to be yet another voice pulling your family in yet another direction, but I strongly believe in these events and I have personally witnessed God working through them. Please don't hesitate to contact me with questions or concerns. The details:


REMINDER REGARDING PRAYER LIST REQUESTS


