Hello All!

This past Monday we had our Lenten reconciliation service. The theme for the service was Discipleship, more importantly *Intentional Discipleship*. After the service a couple of people remarked how much they enjoyed the theme. And one of the priests in attendance stated that as he himself reflected on the theme. It would have been great if we could have had 10 minutes or so between each section to absorb the meaning. So I have decided to do a couple of things, I think over the next few weeks I am going to place sections of this in my article, along with posting the program on the website. I do hope that this can lead to some provoking thought in your heart. So I ask you to simply look as this and pray and reflect all week on each section that I post.

While every disciple is a believer, not every believer is a disciple.

Many people, when they hear the term disciple, they believe it refers to the early followers of Christ. We know that they were a praying, worshipping, loving, giving, and evangelizing group of men and women who refused to keep the truth of the gospel to themselves. Yet, God still desires disciples today, ordinary people like you and me whom God can use to do extraordinary things.

The Christian experience of the believers in the first-century church may seem radical to many in the church today. But to those early believers, it was normal Christianity. And these men and women empowered and motivated by the Holy Spirit turned their world upside down for the sake of Christ. In short, they were truly intentional disciples of Jesus Christ.

Today's reconciliation service is meant be a reflection on whether or not we are intentional disciples of Christ. And if not where are we with our relationship/discipleship of Christ.

Are We Intentional Disciples?

If so our Christian walk will be challenging and exciting, and you will have a sense of purpose and direction. But if your Christian experience is dull, unfulfilling, and boring at times, you need to examine the statements Jesus made concerning what it means to be a disciple.

A disciple is a learner, a pupil, one who comes to be taught

When it comes to a personal discipleship, Jesus is more interested in quality over quantity.

I will continue this with the next article and I will see most of you PLUS either Tuesday, (Christmas Eve) or Wednesday (Christmas Day)

The simple ceremony begins with the reading of the gospel, Luke 2:1-14.

The leader then says: At this feast, we share the joy of heaven. We rejoice with the Holy Family of Bethlehem. Having sighted the first star, we gather at this table to hear glad tidings of comfort and joy. Summoned to the festival we break bread and share the holy wafer. The breaking of this bread brings with is a promise of reconciliation and peace. As we share it with each other, we are bound to forgive each other all the wrongs we have done



in the past, never return to them. Through forgiveness the Lord is born in our family, as Bethlehem, house of bread," happens once again among us. For this reason the holy wacalled is bread of love." Glory to God in Highest Heaven!

Dr. Janet Smith holds the Fr. McGivney Chair in Life Ethics and is Professor of Moral Theology at Sacred Heart Major Seminary. An internationally renowned expert and widely published author, she among other things, is consulter to the Vatican's Pontifical Council on the Family. The first 100 arrivals will get a free CD copy of her famous talk: "Contraception: Why Not?"

The Family as a Path to Holiness: When people become parents they must grow-up; they must become more generous, selfless, disciplined, etc. Thus, a major purpose of children is to make adults of their parents! This humorous talk, filled with anecdotes about family life, will help parents realize the importance of their vocation and provide some insight into how to do it well.

The Sexual Mess that We Are In and How We Got Here: Unwed pregnancies, abortion, and divorce have become rampant in our society. The accompanying toll of broken hearts is all around us. Dr. Smith will explore the causes of our culture's radically altered understanding of the meaning and purpose of human sexuality, and its discounting of the belief that babies are a beautiful gift from God.
