

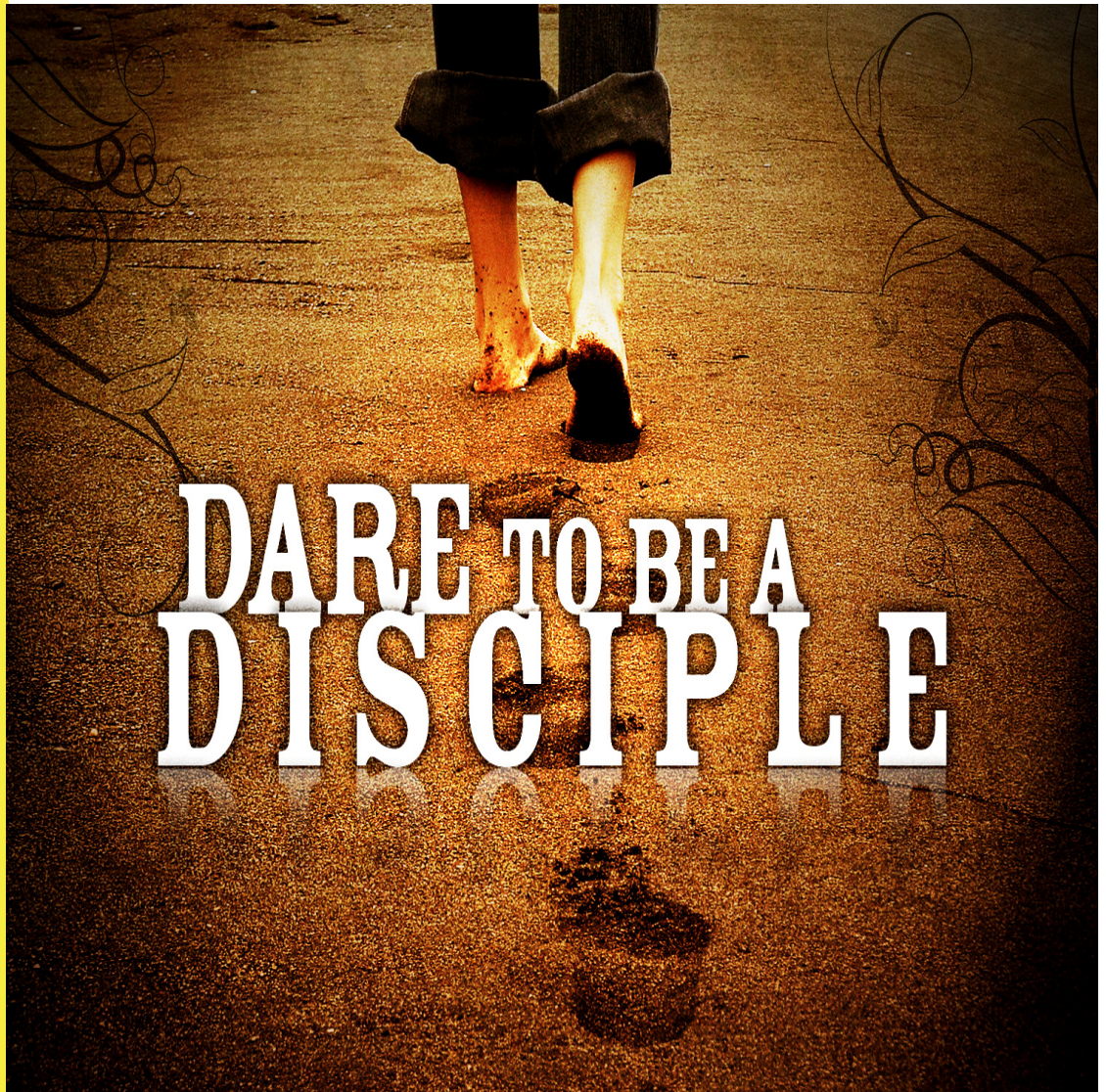

Well all I am off this week and next with 32 of the parishioners for our pilgrimage to Italy. Truly this should be a prayerful trip. I am excited for the people going to experience this spiritual journey. Though we are doing and seeing many things while there, it is the religious aspect that I look forward to.

One of the places we will be going to is Assisi, a place I absolutely gain great spiritual growth from. It is at the beginning of the trip. I so look forward to having SJN parishioners there to hopefully enjoy the same sense. We end the trip with three days in Rome, the center of our Church. The day before we leave for home includes an audience with the Holy Father .

I myself have not been back to Italy since I left there on May 21, 2004 so it is kind of like returning home after a long time away. Italy, especially Rome, is such a special place for our Church and I am happy to help 32 of our SJN family experience a love and fulfillment of this. Please keep us in your prayers over these 9 days while we are away.

Earlier this week I attended the funeral for the mother of Msgr Zenz, a good friend of mine. I know many of you know Msgr Zenz, what a wonderful priest he is and greatly respected in the Archdiocese of Detroit. What none of you know is that along with being the pastor of Holy Name parish in Birmingham, a large parish in the diocese, for the past year he has been the administrator of St Thomas Moore parish in Troy, another large parish in the diocese. The reason I bring this up is for the funeral the two choirs combined together to help with the music, along with the two choir directors. It was a beautiful moment to experience and shows me the importance of parishes working together.

I know that we at SJN try to work with our nearby parishes periodically, but my prayer is that this can be something we do not sporadically, but on a more regular basis. When groups of people with varying gifts come together, sharing those gifts with the greater community, we have the ability to truly fill the world with the message of God in a very positive way.

So as I head on this pilgrimage to Italy my prayer is that the Spirit of cooperation fill all of CANTON so we can fill the word of God at the very least in our community of CANTON not just SJN!

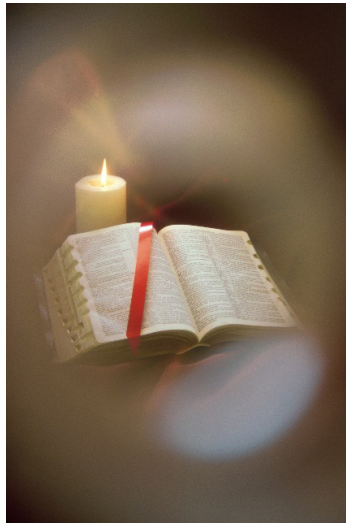

FAITH WORKS

The **January Faith UNwrapped** was an **awesome** experience, especially for the adults. We used the Apostle Andrew as an example of faith. (In the past we looked at the Prophet Jeremiah and two widows, Ruth and Naomi.)

Andrew offers a great example as a follower of Jesus. His gift lies in his willingness and need to bring others to Jesus. He is the one who found the boy with the loaves and fish and brought the boy to Jesus. Then Jesus used this generous gift to feed 5,000 people. What would have happened had Andrew not brought the boy to Jesus?

Andrew also brought his brother, Simon, to Jesus. Andrew originally followed John the Baptizer, but John turned him toward Jesus. Andrew was curious about Jesus and asked him where he stayed. Jesus invited Andrew to come and see. Andrew accepted that invitation and the rest is history.

What is intriguing is that Andrew could not contain himself when he discovered who Jesus was. In “staying with Jesus,” he experienced a profound sense of acceptance, unconditional love, meaning to his life, and personal fulfillment. Andrew had to share this defining experience with his brother, Simon.

So Andrew invites Simon to “stay with Jesus.” We know Simon has a similar experience. Jesus re-names him, “Peter,” - the “Rock,” or “Rocky” if you prefer. In renaming him, Jesus redefines him. Peter will be the rock, the foundation, of faith for the community of believers. A simple invitation has incredible ramifications.

At Faith Unwrapped we focused on “staying with Jesus” to get to know him. One of our discussion questions was: *who is Jesus to you?* The responses were awesome!

One person shared that thinking about God was challenging because God was all-powerful, maybe even scary. But Jesus was different. He was “the soft place where I can land.” Jesus provided unconditional love, total acceptance, healing embrace, and absolute forgiveness. Many of us in the room could relate to that description of Jesus. Like Andrew and Peter, that Jesus could redefine us.

By the way, *who is Jesus to you?*

SJN Varsity Boys#1 Win Again!



In a division battle with first place on the line, the St. John Neumann varsity boys#1 basketball team recorded a huge win by beating Detroit Gesu in a game played at Gesu, by the final score of 53-48. The team came out on fire, racing out to a 17-6 lead after one quarter and lead 27-10 into the second quarter, before Gesu rallied to close the gap to 31-21 at the half. In an incredible reversal of the first half, Detroit Gesu outscored SJN 23-7 in the third quarter to take a 44-38 lead after three. Coach Marek steadied the troops between periods and Danny Lanava drained a three pointer at the start of the fourth quarter to pull SJN within 3. After a missed Gesu shot, Derek Greening pulled down a rebound and again Danny sank a running jumper to cut the lead to 1 at 44-43. A turnover lead to another chance for SJN and Ryan Young sank a 3 point shot to put SJN in front 46-44 . A. J. Neal sealed the game down the stretch by making four free throws, as Gesu was forced to foul. SJN outscored Gesu 15-4 in the final period. The win improved the teams division record to 5-0 while Detroit Gesu sank to 3-2 with the loss. Leading SJN in scoring was guard A. J. Neal, who poured in a season high 30 points to go along with 10 rebounds. Ryan Young had 9 points and 6 assists. Danny Lanava scored all of his 7 points in the fourth period and Derek Greening pulled down 12 rebounds. Other key team members are Justin Polce, Matt Breda, Aaron Garbarino, Adam Pitcole, Jonathan Michalak and Jack Heineman. The team is coached by Angelo Lanava, stat man Nick Aresco and head coach Mike Marek.

Varsity Boys # 2 get Division win.

The Saint John Neumann varsity # 2 team defeated St. Valentine 33-8 to extend their division record to 3-1. (5-2 overall). Leading scorers for the Dragons were Nathan Burnette 14 points, Joseph Vespaziani 7 points and Matt English 6 points. Conor Petretta, Connor Rosiewicz, and Gavin Dewitt. The Dragons are coached by Mike Meagher & Mark Sigler.

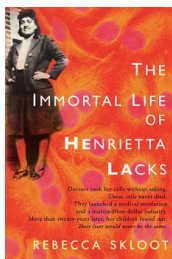
