Hello from Italy!

So I wrote this article before your fellow parishioners land I left for Italy, so I can tell you nothing about how the trip is going. But hopefully all is going good! Anyway, I wanted to talk about a couple things while away.

First I wanted to let you all know that we will be doing a parish mission during this upcoming Lenten season. Thought it is a bit of a time away, I wanted to let you know about it. The mission will take place from April 7 – 9<sup>th</sup>, that is a Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday evening. The title of the Mission is The Four Phrases and it will be led by a good friend and classmate of mine, Fr Josh Wagner. Fr Wagner is a priest of the Diocese of Columbus and he and I spent four glorious years together in Rome studying. I know you are not only going to love the message of the Mission but Fr Wagner as well. I am attaching a link to a website where you can hear from Fr Wagner himself talking to YOU about the Mission:

We are also going to be posting this link on our website, check it out and get to know Fr Josh Wagner!

Next I wanted to talk about the question of General Absolution. The reason I bring this up is because over the course of the past couple weeks I have been asked by a couple of people about this. So I thought, hhhmmmm maybe I should address this for all of you. First let me show you what the law says, then I will explain it!

From the Code of Canon Law, canon 961, the law states:

"Can. 961 §1. Absolution cannot be imparted in a general manner to many penitents at once without previous individual confession unless:

1/ danger of death is imminent and there is insufficient time for the priest or priests to hear the confessions of the individual penitents;

2/ there is grave necessity, that is, when in view of the number of penitents, there are not enough confessors available to hear the confessions of individuals properly within a suitable period of time in such a way that the penitents are forced to be deprived for a long while of sacramental grace or holy communion through no fault of their own. Sufficient necessity is not considered to exist when confessors cannot be present due only to the large number of penitents such as can occur on some great feast or pilgrimage.

§2. It belongs to the diocesan bishop to judge whether the conditions required according to the norm of §1, n. 2 are present. He can determine the cases of such necessity, attentive to the criteria agreed upon with the other members of the conference of bishops."

In the past, not long after Vatican II, general absolution occurred for a while. This practiced was stopped years ago. Unfortunately some priests still offer this and tell people that it is a valid manner in which to receive the sacrament of reconciliation. Sadly that is not the case. The law above states the only conditions in which general absolution can be done.

In the first part of the canon, the law speaks of imminent danger of death. An example of this would be the following: if you are in a plane and it is about to crash, if a priest is on the plane, he can give general absolution to all on the plane, as there would be no time to hear the individual confession of all.

The other case is if you have a large number of people seeking the sacrament but not enough priests to hear their individual confession. For example: I schedule a penance service for the parish and ten priests tell me they are going to help. The night of the service comes and for some strange reason every one of the priests do not show up and I have 800 people for the service and reconciliation. Given this there is no possible way for me, by myself, to hear everyone's confession. Therefore I can offer general absolution, but a requirement would have to be attached. That requirement would be that every person MUST seek individual confession within a reasonable amount of time.

However if a priest consciously conducts a penance service with the intention of offering general absolution, HE the priest, breaks the law of the church.

Basically it is a VERY rare time that general absolution can be offered. The manner in which reconciliation is to be conducted is individually.

I hope you all have a great week and keep myself and your fellow parishioners in your prayers as we continue our pilgrimage in Rome.

# GIVE YOURSELF A PRAYERFUL START TO 2014



You are invited to join other parishioners in small groups to explore the Gospel of Matthew. We will use the Little Rock Scripture Study as our resource for this study.

This resource has been around since the early 1970s when a group of Catholic lay people realized their own need and desire for Bible Study from a Catholic perspective.

Why are we choosing to study the Gospel of Matthew? There are many books of Scripture we could choose to study. We have chosen the Book of Matthew because this is the book from which most of the Gospel readings during this Liturgical year will be read.

The study will begin in early February and continue until Easter. Look for Registration Forms in the Gathering Area.



### FAITH WORKS

**PRESENTATION OF THE LORD** At the end of the fourth century, a woman named Etheria made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. Her journal, discovered in 1887, gives an unprecedented glimpse of liturgical life there.

Among the celebrations she describes is the Epiphany (January 6), the observance of Christ's birth, and the gala procession in honor of his Presentation in the Temple 40 days later—February 15. (Under the Mosaic Law, a woman was ritually "unclean" for 40 days after childbirth, when she was to present herself to the priests and offer sacrifice—her "purification." Contact with anyone who had brushed against mystery—birth or death—excluded a person from Jewish worship.) This feast emphasizes Jesus' first appearance in the Temple more than Mary's purification.

The observance spread throughout the Western Church in the fifth and sixth centuries. Because the Church in the West celebrated Jesus' birth on December 25, the Presentation was moved to February 2, 40 days after Christmas.

At the beginning of the eighth century, Pope Sergius inaugurated a candlelight procession; at the end of the same century the blessing and distribution of candles which continues to this day became part of the celebration, giving the feast its popular name: Candlemas.

#### 3st Quarterly Report Update, - October 1, 2013 - December 31, 2013

Hello Fellow Parishioners,

We, the members of the Saint Vincent de Paul Conference are part of the Christian Service efforts at SJN have just finished our third quarter of service in 2013. We have had a very active group expanding to 30 members joining as full or associate members. We are an all volunteer group supported by the church with meeting space and endorsement from the parish priest, Fr. Ron Richards. The committee has completed its second full year of service on September 2013 by Lorraine and Don Zaksek, (President and Treasurer), and Gerry Gutkowski. (Vice President), and Daniel Faoro (Secretary). We have been blessed to be lead in prayer by Deacon Pat (Spiritual advisor) at the start and close of our meetings.

We were grateful for your response for assistance we made this December and you provided just over \$4,700 in donations. We serve the poor after providing a thorough background check, a review of personal finances and financial budgeting, and assist them in procuring the social service benefits they are entitled to. Since Oct 1, 2013 we have provided \$14,000 in support to 143 people- both families/individuals- to prevent evictions, termination of utility services, meet medical needs, and provide emergency car repair, and food / household needs. In addition to the clothes and other donations to the SVdP store we receive the generous support from parishioners and outreach efforts, "Top Hat Sundays", and other parish fund raisers. We assisted seven families this year through the "Jesse tree" giving program at SJN, and donated to the SVdP Cyclone Relief Program to provide disaster aid to residents of the Philippines. We received support from local business, Meijers, Family Dollar Stores, and Catholic Vantage Financial.

Our members have attended numerous training sessions in the Detroit area to become familiar with skills to serve area residents, learn how to help families apply for social service programs, and state and federal assistance programs for the poor. Our members continue to work on SVdP Metro West area task force committees to develop transportation and housing programs.

Look for the script program registration information handouts on the tables in the entry hall of the church. We are registered for the Kroger Community Rewards Program, Holiday Market eScript and for the Meijer's scrip program.


