

# Cucchi's Corner

John Baptist De La Salle (1651-1719)

Founder of the Brothers of the Christian Schools

During Lent the Chorale is singing a work titled "This Alone" by Tim Manion. Tim was part of the St. Louis Jesuits till 1984. In the '70s and 80's the **St. Louis Jesuits** were a group of Catholic composers who popularized a folk music style of church music through their compositions and recordings. The group, made up of Jesuit scholastics at St. Louis University, used acoustic guitars and contemporary-style melodies and rhythms to set biblical and other religious texts to music sung in English in response to the liturgical reforms of Vatican II. A few years back I heard the group back together at the National Pastoral Musicians summer conference in Indianapolis.

Here are the words to This Alone:

### Antiphon:

One thing I ask, this alone I seek, To dwell in the House of the Lord all my days. For one day within Your temple heals every day alone. O Lord, bring me to Your dwelling.

- 1...Hear, O Lord, the sound of my calling. Hear, O Lord, and show me Your way.
- 2...The Lord is my light and hope of salvation. The Lord is my refuge; whom should I fear?
- 3...Wait on the Lord and hope in His mercy. Wait on the Lord and live in His love.

# LENT SOUP AND BREAD SUPPERS and STATIONS of the CROSS \*\*\*New this year we have added Mac & Cheese and Salad\*\*\*

The three traditional practices during Lent are prayer, fasting and almsgiving. One of the Lenten events that St. John Neumann has offered for a number of years is Friday Soup and Bread Suppers followed by Stations of the Cross. Supper starts at 6:00 PM and runs until we run out of soup or until about 6:50ish. The soups are meat free, and bread, salad and mac & cheese will



also be offered. After dinner there is the option to move to church for Stations of the Cross at 7 PM. At the supper, a donation that would be equivalent to what you would spend on a meal for your family is accepted. **Donations go directly to our St. Vincent De Paul ministry**. Your family is invited to one or both parts of the evening. There are plenty of opportunities to go beyond just savoring the fine soups that are provided every week. In the gathering area there is a sign up board with the following opportunities for you and your family to participate in:

**COORDINATOR:** This individual/ family group supervises the kitchen preparations and the evening's activities. They need to be available from 4:45 PM until clean-up is completed. A list of who has signed up will be provided. Making a reminder call to those who have signed up during the week before the supper is helpful to make certain the evening goes smooth. Training and a walk through the kitchen for the team/individual will be provided.

**SOUP PROVIDER:** Please make or purchase 6 – 9 quarts of meatless soup. You may use a meat base like beef or chicken, as long as there are no chunks of meat. In the soup section they do sell vegetable soup stock and soup base. If we are warming, please get it to the kitchen by 5:15 PM; if you are bringing it hot, bring it by 5:40 PM. Possible soups: Vegetarian Chili, Cabbage, Cream of Broccoli, Mushroom, Corn Chowder, Vegetable, Seafood Chowder or your favorite.

**BREAD PROVIDER**: Please make or purchase One Large Loaf or it's equivalent (about 20 slices). Bring it to the kitchen during the day on Friday by 5:15 PM. Suggestions: Dinner Rolls, Whole Wheat, Rye or other Grain, French or Italian.

**MACARONI & CHEESE PROVIDER:** Please make or purchase your favorite macaroni and cheese. Bring the prepared dish to the kitchen, 5:15 PM if it will need to be warmed or 5:40 if it is hot and ready to serve.

**SALAD PROVIDER:** Provide tossed salad (chopped lettuce & veggies) along with a bottle of dressing. Deliver to the kitchen by 5:15 PM.

**SET UP CREW**: Need to be available from 5:00 PM until 6:00 PM. This team of folks will be responsible for covering and setting the tables, setting out soup bowls, plates, napkins and silverware, preparing beverages, warming food, cutting bread, putting salad in serving dishes and setting up the food area (bread, butter, soup, salad, mac & cheese).

**SERVING CREW:** Need to be available from 5:45 until 7:00 PM. Possibly help with last minute set up details. Serve and replenish the food and beverages, as needed.

**CLEAN UP CREW:** Need to be available from 6:45 PM until area is cleaned up. This crew is responsible to clear and clean the dining area and the kitchen. Packaging leftover food or return to provider. **PLEASE SIGN UP IN THE GATHERING AREA**

# FAITH WORKS

The entry of Jesus into Jerusalem marked a high point in the earthly min-

istry of Jesus. The Galilean made a dramatic show, as he made his way down

the Mount of Olives into the city of David. The crowds gathered, hailed the coming teacher, and praised God for his presence. Of course, this commotion baffled the locals. After all, how could anyone of importance come from the back country? Image the headline of the fictitious newspaper, the Jerusalem World: Country boy makes big entrance into the Holy City!

The gospels clearly tell us that the leadership found Jesus to be a threat; the amount of the threat was (and still is) open for debate. His trial was a hastily held "kangaroo court;" yet, he was arrested alone, as his followers fled. The mob turned against him, even after many in the blood thirsty mob greeted the Galilean into the city with honors. The Lord entered the city in glory, but left it in shame.

Yet, the gospels were not written to relate the story of a failed political figure. The were written to engender faith. From a theological perspective, the tension between the earthly glory of Jesus and his shameful death was less important than his mission from the Father. According to the Synopics, after his Galilean ministry, Jesus made the deliberate decision to go to Jerusalem. There, he would reveal himself as the Messiah. He would not use the image of the righteous high priest that would clean the Temple (as the Essences hoped for), the great warrior king (as many common people expected), or the great teacher (as many Gentiles desired). No, he would be the Suffering Servant found in Second Isaiah. He would show how earthly glory was fleeting. He would also show how serving the divine will would lead to true glory.

The entry into Jerusalem was not the first step of the mission, but it was the first step of the public revelation. The King has come! What we expect of him may delight us, but he may disappoint us. Jesus did not come to fulfill our expectations. He came to fulfill the will of the Father. In essence, that is what Holy Week is all about.

It is now time to set aside personal expectations about Lent. It is now time to walk with the Lord toward his death. It is time to prepare for his glorious resurrection. Set aside time this week to reflect, to pray, and to prepare to celebrate.

Last year, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul at St. John Neumann Church sponsored 5 young people for a week at Camp Ozanam. Their reactions upon returning were exactly what we hoped they would be – "Awesome! Can we go again next year?" We are happy to tell them that yes, they can go again this year; and we would like to send an additional five kids along with them.

Dennis Oszust, a former camper himself, is the Vincentian who is heading up this campaign. If you know of a child who would benefit from a week away at beautiful Camp Ozanam, please contact us 734-455-5910 ext. 17. Each family will be paid a visit, and each child will be interviewed. A physical is provided at no cost to the family, and the campers are provided with debit cards to the SVDP thrift store to purchase necessary items for camping.

This year, 5 weekly sessions are scheduled between July 7<sup>th</sup> and August 4<sup>th</sup>. Three camping programs are offered.

Traditional Co-Ed Camp is for children between the ages of 8-12.

Adventure Camp is for children ages 13-14. There are separate camps for boys & girls. Loving Arms Camp – offered with St. John Health Systems- is for children who have suffered a loss of a friend or family member and are having a difficult time dealing with the loss.

All programs include swimming, hiking, nature study, arts and crafts, drama, and sports activities.

# Dear Parishioners,

A few months ago I informed you that the St. John Neumann Conference of SVdP was actively participating in an Exploratory Committee on Homelessness comprised of members of the Metro-West Council (SVdP conference presidents in western Wayne County, outside of Detroit). Today it is my pleasure to inform you that the Archdiocesan Council of SVdP has reviewed the work of the committee and decided to adopt our recommendations to house the homeless in western Wayne County as a "Special Work" of the Society.

To let you know what a serious problem homelessness is in our own back yard, I am including the data provided by the local school districts in response to our committee's questionnaire regarding the number of homeless children. Due to the lack of adequate shelter in our area, the majority of these children are living in motel rooms with their families.

- 1. Plymouth-Canon 78 children
- 2. Wayne-Westland 248 children
- 3. Livonia 152 children
- 4. Dearborn Heights 202 children

Although it is part of our 3-year plan to build a shelter, we have adopted the *Housing First* philosophy and are in the process of placing two families in housing now. *Housing First* programs place families and individuals as quickly as possible in permanent housing and then provide intensive home-based case management and stabilizing support services to prevent a recurrence of homelessness. As you might imagine, this is a huge undertaking. To begin, until we have adequate funding to hire the professional staff needed, we are highly dependent upon volunteers. The Exploratory Committee members have morphed into the Board of Directors, and I am happy to tell you that Fr. Ron Richards has agreed to be on the board. We are seeking individuals with experience in running a non-profit organization who might also wish to serve., We are especially in need of volunteers with experience in fund raising and attracting corporate donors. If you wish to know more about what we are doing and have a particular skill or talent that would be useful to this project, please contact me through the church office. I will be happy to tell you more. In the interim, please pray for us:

Oh God, when I have food help me to remember the hungry. When I have work, help me to remember the jobless. When I have a warm home, help me to remember the homeless. And remembering, help me to destroy my complacency and bestir my compassion. Make me concerned enough to help by word or deed, those who cry out for what we take for granted. Amen

# The Divine Mercy Chaplet and Novena

The Divine Mercy Novena begins on Good Friday, ending on Saturday, April 26, the day before Divine Mercy Sunday. The Divine Mercy Chaplet/Novena pamphlets are available in the Gathering Area.

"In a vision to Sr. Maria Faustina Kawalska in 1935, the Lord revealed a powerful prayer that He wanted everyone to say – the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy –and He promised extraordinary graces to those who would recite it.

Prayed on ordinary rosary beads, the Chaplet is an intercessory prayer that extends the offering of the Eucharist. It may be said at any time but the Lord specifically requested that it be used as a novena on the nine days before the Feast of Divine Mercy (the first Sunday after Easter).

It is also especially appropriate to say the Chaplet during the three o'clock hour (recalling the time of Christ's death on the cross)."
