As many of you know, we as a parish, offer Eucharistic Adoration every Friday in the Eucharistic Chapel. In fact, last week, a member of the parish spoke to all of you about the Adoration we offer. I wanted to take the time to speak on this topic as well.

First, what is Eucharistic Adoration?

Eucharistic Adoration is a spiritual practice of spending time with Jesus, in the presence of the exposed Host.

“The best kind of friend is the one with whom you can spend time without having to say anything. You can just share the moment and enjoy each other’s company, knowing your relationship is deeper than the spoken word. That kind of silent communication is what takes place between you and Jesus when you participate in Eucharistic Adoration.” (Kathleen M Carroll, America Magazine)

Sadly I have heard said that there is no need for Adoration—one can just sit in front of the Tabernacle or in the body of the Church and pray. It is the same thing. What makes this statement even sadder is that I have heard priests say the same thing. I could not disagree more.

Think about it. You and a good friend are getting together; you are in one room, your friend is in the next room with the door closed. Does that make sense? Of course it doesn’t! However, that is exactly what people are saying when they say “sitting in front of the Tabernacle is the same as having the Eucharist exposed.”

In 2013, on the feast of *Corpus Christi*, Pope Francis said: “Jesus speaks in the silence of the mystery of the Eucharist and reminds us each time that following him means going out of ourselves and making our lives not something we possess, but a gift to him and to others... In the Eucharist, Catholics experience the ‘solidarity of God,’ a solidarity that can never be exhausted and should never stop causing awe.”

About a year ago I spoke on Eucharistic Adoration at mass. After that weekend I received an email from someone, who for some reason, did not like what I said. The email said we have a new Pope and I should get in line with our Holy Father; get into the world, rather than praying in front of the Eucharistic.

I was not angry or upset at the statement. Everyone has the right to feel as they want. However, I was very confused. Why the confusion? Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, spends an hour in Eucharistic Adoration every day! In his own words: “... What I really prefer is adoration in the evening, even when I get distracted and think of other things, or even fall asleep praying. In the evening then, between seven and eight o’clock, I stay in front of the Blessed Sacrament for an hour in adoration.” Pope Francis says he would not have the energy or love for what he does in the world if he did not spend time in prayer in the presence of Jesus EVERY DAY!

Here at St John Neumann we have been offering Eucharistic Adoration every Friday for a number of years. We begin Adoration following the morning mass, approximately 9:30 am and conclude with Benediction, in the evening, at 6:30 pm. I ask any of you who are free during the day to try and spend time each week in Adoration.

We have a sign up board outside the main entrance to the church. I ask you to consider the following: Pick a time, each Friday, that you can spend praying in front of the Blessed Sacrament. Put your name on the time slot on the board. If you can, make this a weekly commitment. Would it not be great to have the chapel full of people all day, every Friday, praying with Jesus?!

At the same time I recognize that for those of you who work during the day this is tough. However, if you cannot make it during the day, maybe you can make it for Benediction at 6:30 pm. For you families out there, bring your kids. There is no better gift you can give your children than the gift to be in the presence of Jesus, their BEST FRIEND!

Greetings from the Stewardship Commission,

Thanks to all of you who participated in the Called and Gifted workshop. It was well attended with approximately 120 participants, most from SJN and some from other states such as Indiana, and from various places throughout Michigan. The presenters were engaging and inspiring. SJN was fortunate to have been able to provide this opportunity.

Thank you to all of you who helped with food, set up, clean up and any other aspect of the workshop, including participation.

As a follow up to the Called and Gifted Workshop, we are attempting to facilitate one on one interviews for discernment of charisms, as referenced by the presenters. It looks like there will be time slots available for several days next week. More interviews may be scheduled for next month. Also the day time interviews on June 25 are for parish staff only. The fee for this service is \$25 (cash or check) which you will give to the interviewer at the time of your meeting.

We are currently working with a calendar program that can be emailed to participants and allow you to sign up directly on the calendar for a time that suits your availability. This calendar will allow you to schedule an appointment with an interviewer to discuss your own Spiritual Gifts Inventory.

The Stewardship Commission is supportive of all opportunities the parish presents to grow our faith and engage more richly in communion with Christ. Forming Intentional Disciples of Christ is another fabulous program coming to SJN in the Fall. Please be sure to watch for opportunities to sign up.

THE FEAST OF SS. PETER & PAUL - On June 29 the Church celebrates the feast day of SS. Peter & Paul. As early as the year 258, there is evidence of an already lengthy tradition of celebrating the solemnities of both Saint Peter and Saint Paul on the same day. Together, the two saints are the founders of the See of Rome, through their preaching, ministry and martyrdom there.

Peter, who was named Simon, was a fisherman of Galilee and was introduced to the Lord Jesus by his brother Andrew, also a fisherman.

Jesus gave him the name Cephas (Petrus in Latin), which means Rock,' because he was to become the rock upon which Christ would build His Church.

Peter spent his last years in Rome, leading the Church through persecution and eventually being martyred in the year 64. He was crucified upside-down at his own request, because he claimed he was not worthy to die as his Lord.

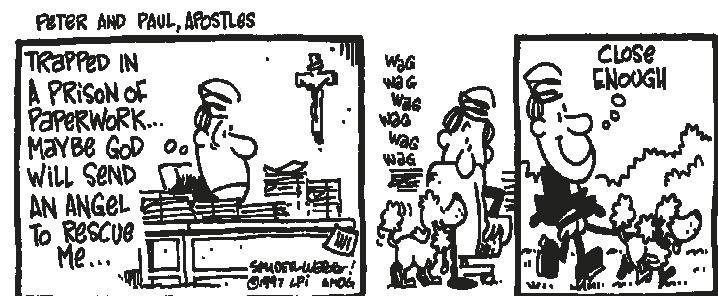
He was buried on Vatican hill, and St. Peter's Basilica is built over his tomb.

Paul was the Apostle of the Gentiles. His letters are included in the writings of the New Testament, and through them we learn much about his life and the faith of the early Church.

Before receiving the name Paul, he was Saul, a Jewish pharisee who zealously persecuted Christians in Jerusalem. Scripture records that Saul was present at the martyrdom of St. Stephen.

Paul was imprisoned and taken to Rome, where he was beheaded in the year 67. He is buried in Rome in the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls.

In a sermon in the year 395, St. Augustine of Hippo said of Sts. Peter and Paul: "Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were as one. Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so we celebrate this day made holy for us by the apostles' blood. Let us embrace what they believed, their life, their labors, their sufferings, their preaching, and their confession of faith."
